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
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
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### **LOCAL HISTORY**

The Collier County Historical and Archaeological Preservation Board is updating its booklet of historic sites and will be working with local historical societies and the Collier County Museum for input. Buildings in this area recently approved for historic preservation are JT's Island Grill in Chokoloskee and the Bula Baptist Mission in Copeland.

The Board has a vacancy with the term expiring on October 1, 2010 representing the category of law or urban planning. This 7-member board is vested with the power, authority, and jurisdiction to designate, regulate, and administer historical, and archaeological resources in Collier County, under the direct jurisdiction and control of the Board of County Commissioners. Terms are 3 years.

### Recipe for Good Eating

**Turkey Burgers** by Marya Repko

# Fishing Report

For some anglers January and February are the two most difficult months to catch trophy fish in the Everglades. For others

it means relatively mosquito-free conditions and great weather. On cold days it's hard to get snook to hit and tarpon seem to disappear. However, some fishing improves at this time of year. Sheepshead move into shallow water and spawn. They can be taken on shrimp and are great eating. While you're fishing for them, mangrove snapper and small black drum make it fun. Redfish will feed all year long, as weather is mild. Tarpon will slip into the backcountry bays when weather becomes unusually warm. Snook seem to move from the river mouths to small creeks in the backcountry. The best fishing for them often take place right before an approaching front. Offshore, mackerel, cobia, pompano and jacks move up and down the coast.

### WHY DO MULLET JUMP?

One of our readers recently asked me if I knew why mullet jump and said that she thought it would be appropriate if The Mullet Rapper wrote an article about it.

While out on the boat, I always enjoy watching mullet jump. They always seem so happy, jumping for joy. This theory most people ignore. Another theory is that they are being chased either by larger mullet or other predators.

Doing some research online, I found that the Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science Library at the University of Miami states that this question has never been answered and that the most likely it is simply "the nature of the fish" and is "the result of fright or playfulness."

However, according to the Australian Museum Fish website, there may be several mullet jumping together simultaneously when predators are chasing them. Or, there may be a single fish jumping with a slower and shorter leap, rolling on its back. This seems to be the case with the "sea mullet" (an inshore species) who jump in order to fill the pharyngobrancial organ located in the back of the throat with air. In places where there is low oxygen, it is believed that the mullet jump more often.

Flip Pallot, a noted Florida sportsman, has his own theory. Mullet are one of the few fish that have a rudimentary gizzard. Flip feels that when they jump, they are packing food into their gizzards to aid digestion.

If you have a theory or an answer, please let us know.

Person? Sort of. What I am is a volunteer in the Volunteers-in-Parks Program. Thousands of volunteers work every year in national parks, preserves, and programs. This winter I'll be at the Gulf Coast Visitor Center in Everglades City. In 2005 I would have been one of 137,000 volunteers throughout the country.

One of my jobs will be to report anything interesting or unusual (or unusually interesting) around and about the park. Bird and wildlife sightings, camping adventures, humorous happenings will become fodder for this column. One unusual experience about a week ago: entering a portable toilet at one of the backcountry keys, a camper was startled when a Burmese python, about five to six feet long, exited, slithering across his feet in the process. The camper lost sight of the snake when it blended into the underbrush. The snake showed no aggressiveness toward the camper. Any sightings of this exotic snake should be reported to park personnel. They have been substantiated as a breeding population. They vie with native wildlife for food and threaten some species of special concern such as the mangrove fox squirrel.

Recent sightings: White pelicans have arrived for the holidays. A reddish egret, a somewhat scarce bird, was sighted by a Gulf Coast Visitor Center visitor this week. The bird was clearly visible from the marina area of the center as it perched on the edge of a nearby sandbar. A peregrine falcon also visited the center 7 a.m. one morning. He moved from behind the visitor center building over to pilings, then to trees near the marina.

### **ENP Gulf Coast Visitor Center Ranger-Led Activities, Winter 2008**
