
From Savannah's Eyes



Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Lindsay


January and February are the two hardest months to produce tarpon and snook for me. Cold fronts blast

through and drop water temperatures and stir up the water with strong winds. Having said that, I have had great fishing days when the weather is good. When we get bad weather, you just have to find protected spots and fish deep & slow. If you like to catch sheepshead and black drum, you should have no trouble. Trout fishing can also be excellent. Capt. Bruce Hitchcock caught all he wanted on the outside points this week. When it's warm, snook and redfish will also feed. Tarpon will move into the back bays and rivers when it's nice. Offshore mackerel, bluefish, cobia, and grouper can be caught on the shallow Gulf wrecks. Many anglers count on live shrimp at this time of year. They can be used whole or in small pieces to tip jigs.

Capt. Bill Lindsay lives in Chokoloskee and has been fishing in the Everglades National Park for 27 years. In 1992 he was Master Angler of the MET Tournament.

VIP Report

I'm back. And does it ever feel good!

For readers who don't know who I am or that I was even gone, this will



be my second winter working as a volunteer for Everglades National Park. Off season I spend in Massachusetts where I've resided for 38 years.

My job as an Everglades National Park VIP (Volunteer-In-Parks Program) includes reporting events in the Gulf Coast portion of the park for the *Rapper*. Sometimes other areas of the park become my focus. Last season, for example, First Lady Laura Bush visited the park for a day and spoke at the Royal Palm visitor center. She helped launch a conservation essay contest for students nationwide. Miami-Dade County fifth grade students spent the day with Mrs. Bush. I was honored to be able to attend when she spoke and to write about it for the *Rapper*.

As this new tourist/visitor season begins, the park has many new employees: law enforcement officers, seasonal rangers and volunteers. This is true for all sections of the park. They've come from all over the country, some from other national parks where they worked this summer. For many this is their first time in the Everglades. I urge residents to be patient with them as they explore around town and pepper everyone with questions about the area.

As I write this, it is a few days before Christmas and our visitor center is *very*, *very* quiet. As far as out-of-towners, tourists, and visitors go, Everglades City is quiet, too. This lull happens to a certain extent every year. Once Christmas Day arrives, the pace will pick up. Last year the increase was dramatic. Just how dramatic this time around remains to be seen.

The park keeps track of the number of visitors to its centers. Last year when it decreased in other parts of the park, it increased here. Overall, however, tourists did not come in the numbers they did the year before. Given the poor state of the economy worldwide this year, many expect the numbers to decline again. I will report about that as the season progresses.

Visitors to our center often ask what facilities, such as restaurants, motels, campgrounds, air boat rides, attractions, museums, etc., are available. The center has lists of these, but they may be out of date. We need to know if new businesses have opened and if others have closed since last year and would appreciate it if residents would let us know of any changes. We don't want to favor any one business over another and want our information to be accurate. To contact the center call, 239-695-3311 or drop in for a visit.
