Seafood Festival weekend was a busy time at the Everglades Airport. More than sixty aircraft flew in over the two day weekend. Some light sport, a few home-builts, and a couple of very rare antiques including a 1943 Howard *(in photo above, thanks to Nathan Goff)* powered by a 450 horsepower 9 cylinder Pratt & Whitney radial engine.

We had the honor of hosting the landing of Chairman Billy in his executive Eurocopter on his visit to present Mayor Sammy with a \$10,000 check for the city.


As things progress through the bureaucracy we can report that the airport improvement projects are moving forward. In order to complete the south taxiway DEP requires wetlands mitigation of a small portion; presently the plan is waiting for approval. Shop drawings have been completed for the hangars foundation and the construction bid award was posted on the County web site on February 9 with expectation that the contract award will be announced by March.

Finally, replacement of the Sheriff's dwelling is now in the hands of the County design contractors and a recommendation is expected by the end of the month. Funding for these projects is provided by the FAA and. for hangars and dwelling. the receipts insurance (finally) for Hurricane Wilma damage.

# Recipe for Good Eating

# **Carrot Bread** by Amelia Mingos



3 cups grated raw carrots (drain before using if very fresh)

Beat sugar, oil, and eggs together. Mix dry ingredients together separately. Combine all ingredients, adding carrots last after beating. Bake at  $350^{\circ}$  for 30-40 mins (3 small tins), 1 hr (2 medium tins) or  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hr (large tin).

Icing:

6 oz cream cheese (room temperature) $\frac{1}{2}$  stick butter or marg2 tsp vanilla2 cups powdered sugar

Combine all ingredients and beat until fluffy. Spread over carrot bread

With so many "books on tape," it is not surprising that we would eventually start reviewing CD's as well as books. I was driving to the Keys this past week and thought it would be interesting listening to some local history along the way. I was not disappointed! The two I chose from our local library in City Hall were "Settlers by the Sea" and "Cracker Country," both produced by the Florida Humanities Council. They included songs, stories and interviews with Florida "old timers," those who had spent many years on the water and out in central Florida's pastures.

"Settlers by the Sea" covered many stories about commercial fishermen, primarily in the Gulf Coast area of Cortez and Tarpon Springs, and in Fernandina Beach in the northeast corner of the State known for its shrimping.

"Cracker Country" interviews the novelist Patrick Smith who became famous with his book "A Land Remembered" which is now a part of the Florida school curriculum. There's music, food, and storytelling in this CD. Both are only about 45 minutes long but full of interesting history. Check them out next time you're driving to Naples!

# Breakfast for "Babe"

Gertie Bales of New Market, Tennessee, owns a home on Plantation Island and has been coming to Florida for over

45 years. Since the death of her husband Carl, she has been accompanied by her son Ronnie and his wife Myra for their winter trips.

Gertie has a local resident that patiently awaits her return each year. The morning after Gertie's arrival, she steps out onto her screened porch and calls, "Here Babe, come here Babe". At the sound of her voice, a yellow-crowned nightheron flies from the mangrove forest along the canal behind the house, and lands on the chain-link fence surrounding the back yard. Babe then cautiously walks the fence until she reaches her "plate" which is attached atop one of the fence posts. Gertie has breakfast already prepared. – either fresh shrimp (already peeled!) or scraps of raw fish left over from someone's fish cleaning operation. Babe then enjoys her breakfast from Gertie's hand while keeping a watchful eye out for crows, barking dogs or strangers. When Babe has coaxed all she can from Gertie, she exits into the mangroves to wait for dinner, which is served around 6:00 p.m.

Babe has been showing up for meals twice a day for over eighteen years. Now, whether this is the original Babe, or one of her progeny, we are not sure. But either way, no matter how many months have past since Gertie, Ronnie and Myra have been serving, Babe is always waiting to hear the sound of her friend's voice the very first morning she calls, "Here Babe, come here Babe". Breakfast is served!

### "Connect Now" Program

The Collier County Education Foundation started 19 years ago with its mission to "enhance learning for Collier county children and their teachers by engaging community support."

# NEWS FROM OUTWARD BOUND

As you leave the Barron River and enter Chokoloskee Bay, you see an



island on the right with white buildings, palm trees, lots of canoes, and a sign saying "North Carolina Outward Bound School". This is Sunset Island and there seems to be a variety of theories about what happens out "on the island". Here are some answers to some of the questions you might have:

#### What is Outward Bound?

Outward Bound is a not for profit school that uses the wilderness as a classroom. Our programs focus on developing compassion for oneself and others, and expanding perceived limits to what one person or a group can accomplish. Our mission statement is: "To inspire people to discover and develop their potential to care for themselves, others, and the world around them through challenging experiences in unfamiliar settings." Here in the Everglades, we also teach about local history and ecology.

# Why is "North Carolina" in the name if you are based in Florida?

There are seven Outward Bound (OB) schools in the US and over 50 schools in 35 countries worldwide. Each OB school has several programs – kind of like a university can have multiple campuses. This program in the Everglades is part of North Carolina Outward Bound School, which is based in Asheville, NC. We have run programs in this area since 1986.

#### So, you work with rough kids, right?

No. There are many great programs in Florida and elsewhere that work with kids who are in trouble or are heading that way. Some other OB schools do this work, but here in Everglades City, we work with adults, college students, and high school students. Many of our courses are contracts with schools, but we also run courses that are open to the public.

#### Is Outward Bound a wilderness survival program?

We do not consider ourselves to be a survival program. However, we do ask our students to simplify their lives while they are on course. We carry abundant food, water, shelter, clothing, and equipment to care for ourselves. We challenge our students to learn camping skills and how to take care of themselves while away from the comforts of town. Most teenagers return with a newfound appreciation for their home and parents!

#### What do your groups actually do?

We pack up and go on canoe and sea kayak expeditions in the Everglades for 5 to 14 days! The majority of our courses here are 5 day long canoeing courses, with ten students and two instructors. We teach our students how to keep themselves safe and navigate through the Ten Thousand Islands, getting them to a point of mastery where they can night paddle to our base camp, on Sunset Island, the last night (usually from one of the islands on the Gulf) with no assistance from their instructors.

**Update on ROGG**

The River of Grass Greenway (ROGG) project has received another letter of support: from the Collier County Health Department, again emphasizing the importance for more citizens to exercise. Biking and walking are two of the most available and spontaneous of all forms of exercise. The River of Grass Greenway is a safe, non-motorized transportation and recreation corridor across the Everglades between Naples and Miami, that provides opportunities for education, stewardship, and preservation of the environmental, historic, and cultural assets of this unique area.

This time of year more and more bicyclists are traveling along the Tamiami Trail and it is dangerous. Visitors from all over the world are biking and stopping along this road to view the wildlife. Automobile drivers are now having to slow down to go around these tourists. ROGG will be a separate pathway, allowing people to get off the main road to bike or walk. Drivers will be able to continue traveling at the designated speed. Because it will be located alongside the Trail, there is no environmental impact on the wetlands.
