WILDLIFE CROSSING

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), on behalf of the Defenders of Wildlife and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, presented two proposals for a Wildlife Crossing between Bass Road and Turner River Road on US-41 during the workshop on July 30.

The difference between the plans is the placement of the fence on the north side of the Trail: either within the FDOT right-of-way along the road (Alt. A) or across the canal on NPS land (Alt. B). In both cases, there would be two underpasses for panthers, a gap across Turner River, and private access gates. The estimated costs are either \$8,850,146 or \$8,922,946. A "no build" alternative is also possible.

Some attendees at the meeting would like other options to be considered for this area: flashing lights, rumble strips, lower speed limit, night-time motion sensors. Concerns were expressed by tribal, commercial, and recreational interests about the proposed fencing and tunnels. One very experienced conservationist worried that *"the proposed designs will certainly destroy much of the aesthetic beauty of the area"*.

CITY COUNCIL REPORT

Mayor Sammy Hamilton welcomed everyone back after the Council's break and thanked Elaine Middelstaedt for organizing such a great Independence Day Celebration on July 5. There was spontaneous clapping in agreement.

Along the same theme, Jim Thompson from Collier County Parks & Recreation said that the Air National Guard Band, which he brought down here on July 5, really enjoyed themselves



and want to march in our parade next year. He presented the Mayor with a photo from the Band expressing their thanks.

The Mayor said that most of his report was in the letter he sent to householders last week. He has been busy getting funding to improve the City. He did a presentation to SFWMD about the water treatment plant, asking for a \$200,000 grant for modernization. He is also looking for grants to finish fixing the roads and to improve the sewer plant. And, we have received \$60,000 from Collier County for new fencing and playground equipment in McLeod Park.

Lt. Mark Milligan, on behalf of Collier County Sheriff's Office, reminded us that August 4 was National Night Out. Information leaflets were available in City Hall and deputies would be in Lee Cypress / Copeland after the meeting. He reported several recent thefts in the area before introducing Sue Gentry, Crime Prevention Officer. She said that she is planning to visit businesses who have been burglarized to improve their security and that she could also do private home security surveys. She said we should not hesitate to phone the Sheriff's Office if we saw something suspicious; it is better to report it, even if the noise you hear turns out to be just a cat, than to let a neighbor's house get robbed.

The Mayor thanked Sue for all the help she has given the community. Councilman Parker Oglesby said that the "Hot Summer Nights" programs for youngsters last month went really well, thanks to the Sheriff's officers.

The Mayor announced that he was appointing Mike Klein to a Committee that advises members of the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO).

Council agreed to hold the first reading of the new budget on September 8 with a second reading on September 15. There will also be a full Council meeting on September 8.

Recipe for Good Eating

Sue's Green Curry by Sue Philliskirk from Weipa, Australia (visiting Patty & Steve Huff)

Prawns or Permit 2 TBS Green Curry Paste 1 Onion, finely chopped 7 TBS Fish Sauce Handful of Coriander Leaves, Basil, and Lemon Grass 1 – 1 ½ cans Coconut Milk 1 TBS Palm Sugar or Brown Sugar 2 Regular Sized Potatoes, cubed 2 Cups Green Beans Jasmine Rice Mango or other fruit chutney

Brown onion in butter or oil; add curry paste and cook for 3 minutes. Add coconut milk, then sugar. Add fish sauce, coriander, basil and lemon grass. Add potatoes and beans. Simmer until cooked.

Add prawns or fish. Cook till tender. Serve over rice with mango chutney on the side.

Sue's Pumpkin accompaniment to Curry Dish

- ¹/₂ Small Pumpkin, chopped small or cubed (may use butternut squash if fresh pumpkin unavailable)
- 2-3 Cloves of Garlic, chopped
- 1 Onion, chopped and browned
- 3 TBS Mustard Seeds
- 2 TBS of Butter

Melt Butter and add garlic and onion, then pumpkin. Cook for 10 minutes; then add mustard seeds and cook till softened. Stir till mashed. Serve with above Curry Dish.

Sue fixed this for us during her visit to Everglades City and it was DELICIOUS!!

NEED HELP?

All of the above are only handling crisis situations such as folks faced with eviction or utility cutoff in the current economy.






Fishing Report

Fishing in August in the Everglades can be wonderful. The fish generally feed early and late in the day. Thunder storms usually build up in the

afternoon and move this way from the south; sometimes you can outrun them but not always. Tarpon fishing has been pretty good. Most of these fish are in passes and like to feed just before dark on a falling tide. Capt. Jim Conley has been catching his share of large snook, fishing early and late in the day. Redfish are not temperature-sensitive and can be caught all day long. Capt. Don Cochran is catching some cobia, permit, tripletail, and snapper on the shallow Gulf wrecks. If things are slow, you can always catch a shark on a strip of ladyfish. If you have not hooked a blacktip shark on light tackle, you will be surprised how much fun it can be. They run and jump like a tarpon. In short, fishing in August can be great – sometimes you're the only boat on the water.

Capt. Bill Lindsay lives in Chokoloskee and has been fishing in the Everglades National Park for 28 years. In 1992 he was Master Angler of the MET Tournament.
