Recipe for Good Eating

Pineapple Cups Dessert

submitted by Gail Carr of Duck Key

1/2 c sugar

1/4 c flour

1/8 t salt

1 14-oz can pineapple tidbits with 2/3 cup juice (syrup) saved

3 T lemon juice

grated rind of 1 lemon

2 T melted butter

3/4 c milk

3 eggs (separated)

Mix sugar, flour & salt; add pineapple syrup, lemon juice, rind, egg yolks, melted butter and milk; mix. Fold in egg whites (beaten stiff); pour over pineapple tidbits in individual ovenproof custard cups. Bake in pan containing 1" hot water in moderate oven (325°) for 45-50 min. Chill. Makes 6 servings.

Big Cypress Requests Comments

Big Cypress National Preserve announced that a draft Floodplain Statement of Findings has been prepared for their GMP Addition which includes a provision to retain three existing structures located in the 100-year floodplain: 1) the Carnestown site with two structures: Collier County Sheriff District 7 substation and the Everglades Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center; and 2) the Copeland site with one structure: NPS fire operations center. These sites have been occupied and utilized for many years. Since the GMP is recommending that they be retained and continue to be used, the NPS must prepare the Statement of Findings 'to be in compliance with their management policies. This describes the flood hazard, alternatives, and possible mitigation measures for the continued use of this area. The draft is available for public review with comments being accepted through June 4, 2010, online at http://parkplanning.nps.gov/bicy. Written comments should be addressed to: National Park Service, Denver Service Center -Planning Division, Attention: Big Cypress National Preserve Planning Team, P.O. FWC News

Permits for saltwater fishing and for some hunting will increase in price on July 1 so FWC advises that you buy yours before that date. They are available at the tax collector s'office in City Hall or online at www.fl.wildlifelicense.com.

Recreational red snapper season is from June 1 to July 23 this year and applies to State as well as Federal waters in the Gulf. The bag limit is 2 fish per person but the captain & crew of a charter boat are not allowed any. The minimum size is 16 inches.

The season for recreational and commercial fishing of shallow-water groupers in Atlantic and Monroe County waters opened on May 1.

Regulations for bonefish will be extended to Federal waters on July 1. The bag limit is 1 per person. Minimum length is 18 inches using hook-and-line gear only.

New rules about captive wildlife will take effect on July 1. These include a hobbyist category for personal collections.

FLORIDA FLORA

Canna Lily

(Canna x generalis)

The Canna Lilies (although not a true lifty)" are very attractive outdoor landscaping plants. *Canna flaccida* is native to the southeastern U.S. and Central America and the Antilles. *Canna indica* is native to tropical Central and South America. The many hybrid selections are of garden origin, some dating back to the 18th century. Canna species and various hybrids have naturalized in wetlands throughout the



subtropical and tropical world and are known as "x generalis".

The Cannas are tropical (but also do well in temperate climates) and generally planted in groups. Find a nice area in your yard that receives full sunlight where the soil drains well. The plant pictured here has received no attention and even survived salt water intrusion during Wilma.

It is best to plant during the spring and summer when the soil is warm so that the roots and sprouts form quickly. Cannas are easy to propagate by dividing off pieces of the rhizomes.

The most common colors of their asymmetrical flowers are orange, red-orange, yellow, and red but may also be found in pink, apricot and white. You may prune the plants and use the flowers for bouquets. The large leaves should be left in place to gather sunlight and nourishment during their few months of rest. Leaf-rolling caterpillars can be devastating to the foliage but are easily controlled with dusts or sprays.

Glades Daze

We are still checking the flow of oil and the possibility of oil coming ashore in southwest Florida; however, to date it doesn t seem to be a

As I follow the media, we here in Florida were on the verge of allowing our State to be the next victim. Hopefully, in the future, common sense and respect for our shorelines will keep this potentially harmful harvest of our natural resources out of Florida.

LOCAL HISTORY

Continuing on the theme of jails, the first one was on the Circle where Susie s' Station now stands. The original building was completed in time for this fuzzy old photo (courtesy of Collier County Museum) taken during the opening of the Tamiami Trail on April 26, 1928.

The first Sheriff was Capt W. R. Maynard who also flew an aerial survey over the area in 1926. It is mentioned on the CCSO website that Mrs Maynard bravely rounded up fugitives one time when her husband was away. In 1928 Louis Thorp took over as Sheriff and served until his death in 1954.

There were living quarters on the second floor for the deputy. Some of the prisoners were allowed out to entertain the public by singing at Club Everglades, the Community Center.

After the new jail was finished (see Rapper, 4/30/10), this building was used as lodgings. Inez Magill recalls in her memoirs From Ticks to Politics that she moved to the Freedom Apartments "(called The Old Jail by everyone). She had come from LaBelle to ECity in 1951 as assistant to County Clerk Ed Scott.

Ms Klotz told the *Rapper* that when she arrived here in 1969 the old jail was used as a day care center for kiddies. It was finally torn down.

Please tell us what you remember about the old jail.

Bula Mission

At the meeting on May 10, the Everglades Society for Historic Preservation discussed the old Bula Mission in Copeland. Experts are being asked to determine if the building can be saved. The old church belongs to the Frances Hodge Community Center Foundation, a non-profit set up by Ms Frances so that the property could be used for the benefit of the community. The church was built in the 1940s by the Lee Tidewater Cypress Company and served the black congregation until integration.

MUSEUM NEWS

Deborah Mitchell, whose works are being displayed in the Museum during May and June, talked about her creations during the reception to Meet the Artist ön May 8. She uses the Leaf Project with school students to focus on endangered species. The leaves are dipped in epoxy to make them permanent after the children have written on them. Her exhibit also includes some large photos and artifacts, all with wetlands or Everglades themes.



The Museum is open Tuesday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and on Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. There is a permanent exhibit about our history and several short films. The Museum has no admission charge but donations are welcome.

Off the Shelf Book Review

Images of Hope:
A photographic journey through Immokalee

This large-format illustrated book takes us on a photo journey of the lives of the immigrants working in Immokalee. It is the result of a project funded by the Community Foundation of Collier County about one of the poorest areas of Southwest Florida. The population of Immokalee increases from 25,000 residents to 40,000 during the agriculture season which coincides with our season of the more affluent winter visitors. The photos bring to life the everyday activities of our neighbors just north of Everglades City: their work with the cattle ranchers, the farmers in the fields planting seeds, the early morning cooks preparing the tortillas and their domestic situation. Fewer than 6,000 housing units are available and these photographs graphically portray the dire condition in which the migrants live. But, the book also shows the wonderful support system and the love, happiness, and hope of this community. Immokalee has received increased attention from many generous people and non-profit organizations who have volunteered their time and money to provide a glimmer of hope by helping with the education, healthcare, and housing needs of the hard-working people. To catch just a glimpse into the lives of the Immokalee workers, those who provide the work for the food we eat and enjoy, check out this book at our local library here in Everglades City. Beautifully presented.

WOODPECKERS NEST

Across from the school, two woodpeckers have made a nest in a Royal Palm tree. Woodpeckers seek out palm trunks, usually ones that have been damaged and become hollow. The woodpeckers are attracted to the insects and carpenter ants that inhabit the moist wood of dead trees. They use their



bills to peck through the trunks to make their nests. The two woodpeckers that built their nests inside this palm tree were spotted by Beth White from the Media Center. They are beautiful to watch but can be damaging to your home since it could be a sign of deteriorating or moist wood in your roof.

ORV PARK AT JETPORT

The Dade County Parks Department has plans to build an ORV park at the old jetport site containing 15 miles of ORV trails. Collier County has endorsed this plan and sent a land use change amendment to the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) for comment. In a report issued on April 2 the DCA has called the proposal a threat to the Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan (CERP) as well as adversely affecting the wildlife, among other issues. Collier County has 60 days to address DCA scomments but is not obligated to follow their recommendations to revisit the suitability of this project or to reject the amendment.
