

#### Community Safety Team Meets FCD

"Hope has come to Everglades City" commented Community Safety Team (CST) member Lisa Marteeny after a meeting on May 21 between members of the CCSO Everglades Area CST and Renee Soulis, Southeast Regional officer for Freedom from Chemical Dependency (FCD).

The meeting resulted in the creation of a 12-member "Prevention Task Force" consisting of 6 CST members plus 2 representatives each from Drug Free Collier and the Sheriff's Office. Two additional members will be solicited from within the community at large. Having gathered pertinent information, FCD will now draft a proposal to secure the grant funds necessary for the creation of a 5-year prevention program to be specifically designed for our area

FCD, a non-profit substance abuse prevention organization, has been active in the prevention field for over 30 years and to-date has worked with over a million students at 800 schools in more than 40 countries on five continents. For more info, see www.fcd.org.

#### **STREET LIGHTS**

The old lamp posts, which were removed from the median on Collier Avenue (CR-29) coming into town, will be installed on the side of the road, according to a statement to the *Rapper* by an electrician for the contractors.

There are four styles of the lamp posts which differ slightly in their fluting and shape. About 100 posts have been installed over the years since the opening of the Tamiami Trail in 1928.

The original glass globes have long since been replaced by plastic replicas which can still be sourced.







## **CHURCH NEWS**

We briefly introduced Rick Heers, the interim pastor at Everglades First Baptist, in our last issue. Here is the rest of his email with some background.

Rick Heers is a graduate of Houghton College in upstate NY and holds a Master's degree in educational administration from the University of South Florida. In addition to serving churches in New York, St. Petersburg, Fort Myers and Immokalee, he has been a Christian school and public school administrator for over 30 years.

He and his wife Judy are presently members at First Baptist Church on Lake Trafford Road in Immokalee and pastored Friendship Baptist Church in Immokalee for 9 years. For the past four years he started a long-term disaster recovery after Hurricane Wilma and has been the director of the relief program, dealing with a recovery that includes setting up over 80 FEMA mobile homes for families impacted by Wilma, rehabbing over 450 homes, and rebuilding 7 homes from the ground up for low-income families, using funds from the government and faith-based organizations.

It is his and the church's hope and plan to be able to find a pastor for Everglades First Baptist this fall or winter.



## **Fishing Report** by Captain Bill Lindsay

Fishing in the Everglades in June can be great. Afternoon thunder storms can make things difficult. They seem to build down south and

move up the coast to the north. Usually, you can outrun them if you don't wait too long. Hot still weather in the middle of the day can slow things down and if you fish in the backcountry, bug spray is a must. Snook fishing has been slow but some nice fish have been caught. Tarpon can be red hot when the wind is down. Redfish don't mind high water temperatures and will feed all day. Trout still feed on the grass flats and more than one angler has hooked a giant tarpon while casting for them. Offshore, permit, cobia and triple tail are active when the weather permits. This has been a long hard year of fishing for all of us. Let's hope things get back to normal soon.

Capt. Bill Lindsay lives in Chokoloskee and has been fishing in the Everglades National Park for 30 years. In 1992 he was Master Angler of the MET Tournament.





Not many people realize that the Everglades National Park Gulf Coast Visitor Center here in Everglades City has a nature path that is located on the property just across from the Lookout Tower next to the Oyster House Restaurant. The path is kept mowed and even on a summer morning, I experienced only a few mosquitoes. As you walk along the marked lane, there are signs listing the type of plants and trees that are located throughout the nature trail. The Sea Oxeye Daisy (*Borrichia frutescens*) marker states that this plant is "common near beaches and mangrove forest, the yellow flower heads of this plant attract many types of butterflies. A member of the Aster family, its fleshy leaves are covered with fine hairs that give a gray-green appearance." So, not only do you get a chance to enjoy a nice walk but you'll learn something about our native flora as well.


