Recipe for Good Eating

Turkey Hash by Patricia Huff

- 1 1/2 pounds medium Yukon Gold potatoes
- 5 tablespoons unsalted butter, divided
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2 finely chopped green peppers
- 1 cup shredded cooked turkey (preferably dark meat)
- 4 large eggs

Cook potatoes in boiling water for 20 minutes; drain, peel, grate and set aside. Melt butter (4 TBS) in a nonstick skillet over medium heat and sauté onions and peppers until brown, about 8 minutes. Add potatoes, turkey, salt and pepper to taste, and cook for 15 to 20 minutes until browned, turning occasionally. Fry eggs in 1 TBS butter and serve on top of hash.

Fishing Report by Captain Bill Lindsay

When people call me at this time of year and ask "How's the Fishing?", the only thing I can say

is that it all depends on the weather. After a strong cold front, when the wind is coming out of the Northeast and the temperatures are in the 40's, it's tough. When it's warm and calm, fishing can be great. Even large tarpon can be found in good numbers. Fishing for redfish in November was pretty good. Capt. Tim Brady and Mike Merritt, both caught lots of Red's using shrimp on the bottom. They fished the outside points in the Lostmans River area on the incoming tide. Snook fishing has not been great. Most of the fish seem to be in the backcountry. Cobia fishing has been good on the outside wrecks. If you want to try something different, try anchoring and chumming with a block of frozen chum for mackerel and bluefish. Blue crabbing is a great way to enjoy the backcountry if you're not fishing.

Capt. Bill Lindsay lives in Chokoloskee and has been fishing in the Everglades National Park for 30 years. In 1992 he was Master Angler of the MET Tournament.

FLORIDA FLORA by Patricia Huff

Blue Porterweed (Stachytarpheta jamaicensis)

I first came across this "weed" at JT's in Chokoloskee. Avery Sumner had planted it along the side of the building and it spread throughout the patio area. She loved to plant wildflowers that attracted butterflies. The Porterweed usually reaches a height of 3 to 4 feet and prefers sun and partly shady areas. I transplanted some to a large pot on my deck and it does very well as a patio plant with small blue to purple flowers blooming year round. The leaves are dark green, oval and pointed with rough edges. It has a woody, brown stem which may be single or multi-stemmed. It is considered a sprawling shrub plant so keep in a pot if you want to "contain" it. You'll enjoy the blooms and the butterflies in your garden.

LOCAL HISTORY

Marco Island wasn't always a maze of condos and shopping malls. The island started out much like our own area with farming and fishing. Prominent families were the Barfields, Stephens, Horrs and Colliers - not Barron Collier, although he did play a role later, but W. D. and his son W. T. Collier. The clamming industry had two canning factories which provided work for locals throughout the Ten Thousand Islands. Pineapples were one of the successful agricultural crops.

The island was finally linked to the mainland with ferries, a railway, and a bridge for automobile traffic but the mass clearing of land and building of high-rise hotels did not start until the 1960s.

Craig Woodward, a Marco resident for more than 40 years, has studied the island's early days and is president of the Marco Island Historical Society. He will give an illustrated lecture about "Marco Island Pioneers" on Friday, December 3, at 5:00 p.m. in the Everglades Community Church Fellowship Hall. There is no charge and everyone is welcome. 


Off the Shelf – Book Review

Hidden History of Everglades City and Points Nearby by Maureen Sullivan-Hartung
