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CITY COUNCIL REPORT

Mayor Sammy Hamilton reported briefly at the meeting on December 7 about improving our water and about the commercial docks and the airport. He is optimistic but knows that much hard work will be involved.

He reminded us of the events taking place in the City and hoped everyone would come out to support the Light Parade on Saturday evening.

Patty Huff gave an update on the River of Grass Greenway (ROGG), a non-motorized multi-use path parallel to the Tamiami Trail which could be enjoyed by walkers, anglers, and cyclists. She stressed that it would bring in tourism revenue as well as providing a safe transportation alternative.

The Mayor said he was proud of our little City and tried to make sure that litter along the streets was picked up before each weekend. The new planting in the median on East Broadway will be officially recognized at a ceremony on **Tuesday, January 4**, at 5:00 p.m. just before the next City Council meeting.

Finally, the Mayor and Councilors wished everyone a happy festive season.

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

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Recipe for Good Eating

Apple Cinnamon Whole Wheat Muffins

1 cup All Purpose or Unbleached Flour 1 cup Whole Wheat Flour

½ Cup Sugar 2 t. Baking Soda

1 T. Cinnamon ½ t. Salt

2 Cups peeled and shredded Apples (3 medium)

1/2 Cup shredded Carrots

½ Cup Golden Raisins

½ Cup chopped Walnuts or Pecans

½ Cup Crisco pure vegetable oil (or Olive oil)

1/4 Cup Milk

2 t. Vanilla Extract

2 large Eggs

Combine flours, sugar, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in large bowl. Add apples, carrots, raisins, walnuts. Mix well. Add oil, milk, vanilla and eggs just until mixed. (Place the two eggs on the side of the bowl and beat with a fork before folding into mixture.) Fill muffin cups $\frac{3}{4}$ full. Bake 375° for 20-25 minutes until toothpick in center comes out clean. Immediately remove from pan. Cool. Makes 12 muffins.

All cell phone numbers are being released to telemarketing companies and you will start to receive sales calls. You will be charged for these calls. To prevent this, call the the National DO NOT CALL list from your cell phone at 888-382-1222. It will only take a minute of your time and blocks your number for five years.

Lt Milligan of the CCSO reminded us that emails which appear to be legitimate are really scams to get your private information. If a large bank or email provider or the IRS ask you to reply with your Social Security or account numbers, do not answer it and do not click the website link if there is one.

FISHING NEWS

We received these comments and photo (note the heron on the back of the boat) by Sandy Moret from Florida Keys Outfitters (www.floridakeysoutfitters.com) fishing with Captain Steve Huff:

The weather outside is frightfully cold. The only positive note to the cold weather is usually associated with very clear skies so you can see what you're not catching. The body metabolism of the fish is greatly reduced and often making a snook respond can be difficult. The wild hogs are running at Lostman's River. The redfishing can be great and they are much more cold hardy than snook and will continue to bite readily.

FLORIDA FLORA

Broad Thatch Palm (Thrinax excelsa)

Although we don't have the typical, traditional "Christmas" trees in south Florida, we do have interesting palms that display their beauty at this time of year. This tropical species (endemic to Jamaica) is showing off its infructescence with white beads looking like Christmas ornaments.

The trunks can grow up to 35 feet tall and 8" in diameter with large circular deep green fronds five to six feet. The *Thrinax excelsa* does require more water since it is not drought or cold tolerant. It does grow faster than other palms and is considered to be the most tropical looking due to its large leaves.

The first Christmas was celebrated surrounded by palm trees so it is appropriate that we highlight one of the most beautiful palms this time of year.



FWC News

As temperatures drop, manatees come to warmer waters. The FWC warns boaters to look out for these gentle giants.

FWC met on December 1 and 2. Among the items considered were a youth program and changes to the hunting regulations in managed lands plus changes in commercial fishing in Gulf waters.

Derelict or "At Risk" vessels in state waters will be entered into an FWC data base after they are reported by marine patrols. Owners will be contacted and the vessel will be tagged. FWC can charge the cost of removal if the owner does not correct the situation.

LOCAL HISTORY

Members and friends of the Everglades Society for Historic Preservation attended an interesting presentation on December 3 about Marco Island early history. Speaker Craig Woodward said that he came to the island with his parents in 1968 and can remember empty beaches.

Earlier homesteaders settled in Caxambas where J. M. Barfield bought what is now the Barfield sub-division in 1919. He married Tommie Stephens (the "Queen of Marco") who helped Barron Collier purchase much of the land. The couple operated the Heights Hotel and Mrs. Barfield's mother ran the Stephens Boarding House.

At the other end of the island, in Olde Marco, W. T. Collier established the Lodge to take in visiting anglers. He and his son Captain W. D. Collier had a store and boatyard and built the Old Marco Inn.

The informative evening revealed that there are still some older buildings on the island which are used as private houses plus a cemetery on Bald Eagle Drive.

Off the Shelf – Book Review

"The Cruelest Miles"

I happened on this book in my closet the other day, a gift from a friend which I had set aside and forgotten, at least for awhile.

The Cruelest Miles is a non-fiction account of an incident in Alaska that captivated the national news in February 1925. Ice bound Nome is besieged with a diphtheria epidemic. Caught with an insufficient quantity of antitoxin to combat this child-killing disease, it appears disaster is imminent.

The antitoxin is located in Seattle, transported by ship and train to Fairbanks and then by dogsled the final 675 miles through countless blizzards and minus 70-degree temperatures in a race to save children's lives. This is truly a testament to the human spirit and man's humanity to his fellowmen.

A great and inspirational story. It also gives a glimpse of how far we have come with medicine and technology in less than a century. It describes in detail the remarkable animals that pull these sleds. Their ability to follow a trail in a total white out even when the driver cannot even see his dog team.
