## **CITY COUNCIL REPORT**

On Tuesday, February 8, Mayor Sammy Hamilton reported at the monthly City Council meeting that he had met with South Florida Water Management District and that the City has secured a grant to clean up the water system, although this may take another year and a half. The Mayor also said that the new Water Plant Operator, Jim Vaughn, who had 31 years of service in the Air Force, has started working on the problems by changing the filters and getting the pumps to work again.

Councilwoman Tammy Gervais reported that the auditors are reviewing all the Seafood Festival revenue and expenses and she will have a report at the next Council meeting. She noted that the Betterment Association started out with a deficit of \$40,000 and their goal was to break even this year. She believes that this was accomplished but will have a full report shortly. Councilman Parker Oglesby thanked all the volunteers, especially Terry Smallwood and everyone else for picking up the trash. Councilwoman Elaine Middelstaedt reported that all of the non-profit organizations, as well as Everglades City School, benefited from the large turnout of visitors to the Seafood Festival. She thought it would be important to get a full accounting from the area organizations to see how well they did; a portion of their proceeds are to come back to the Betterment to cover certain costs.

The next City Council meeting will be on **Tuesday**, **March 1**, at 5:30 p.m. A representative from Congressman David Riviera's office will meet with constituents that afternoon. Commissioner Jim Coletta will not be here but can be contacted at 252-8391.



## SHERIFF'S REPORT

Sgt. Todd Taylor reported at the City Council Meeting that there have been no serious crimes since the last Council meeting. Representatives with the Department of Transportation were here in January to ride with the deputies and looked at certain safety issues along US-41, specifically the vegetation at the corner of SR-29 and the Tamiami Trail. He stated that it may be necessary to install a stop light (rather than a blinking light) at this intersection. The DOT also noted the cars pulling off the road near Big Cypress Bend to fish or watch the wildlife. The Sheriff's department hopes that they will install signs to discourage travelers so the officers can enforce a no-stopping law.

The Seafood Festival went very smoothly with no fights; there was a report of a missing purse but it was found by one of the vendors and a golf cart had been moved. The only incident was that two coolers belonging to the Betterment Association were missing. He also mentioned that many officers throughout the County volunteered their time to come on their day off to help with making the Festival safe.

## Recipe for Good Eating



#### Jalapeno Cheese Grits

2 cups quick-cooking grits

2 ½ cups grated extra-sharp Cheddar cheese ½ stick unsalted butter 1 tablespoon hot sauce (eg, Tabasco) 3 large eggs, well beaten 1 jalapeno, finely diced ¼ cup canned chopped green chiles

½ tsp ground red pepper Garlic salt, salt & pepper to taste

Preheat oven to 350°F. Cook the grits according to the directions on the back of the package. Remove from the heat and add next 6 ingredients. Stir well and season to taste. Pour into a buttered 9x13-inch baking dish and bake for 1 hour. Let cool slightly before slicing and serving. Enjoy!

Growing up during post-WWII days, I spent my summers with my grandparents in DeSoto County. I remember hanging out at my friend's dad's fish market where he got fresh mullet from Placida, FL, shipped in wooden barrels packed with ice. He also was trading in cow hides and gator skins. I went on many a trip in an old Model "A" car cut down for a flatbed truck. The body was wood to keep the salt brine from the hides rusting it out. He went out on the prairies to collect hides. Sometimes he had his wind-up Victrola record player with him. He would play songs to the crowd at a pre-designated place and time. After the music stopped, all the trappers put their products out. He would start bargaining for the prices. Sometimes a live rattlesnake was offered for sale to Ross Allen's Reptile Gardens. After taking care of business, we headed back to town.

#### FLORIDA FLORA

## Angel Trumpet Plant (Brugmansia)

Spectacular is the word that comes to mind when you see this beautiful South American native shrub in full bloom with its strong fragrance in the evening. Also known as Angel Star, its leaves are about 10" long and 6" in diameter with the flowers, similar in shape to a trumpet, growing up to 12". This photo was taken in a neighbor's yard and the flowers are white but can also be yellow or pink. They usually bloom in the rain forests of Brazil but do well in our climate in South Florida, year round, and more often when the nights are cool and the days are hot. It is important to water the plant often, especially if you keep it in a pot. This particular plant was grown from a cutting of a shrub planted by Avery Sumner years ago at JT's in Chokoloskee, but they are usually grown from seeds. Be careful when handling the seedpods since there is a concentration of poison inside; it is best to handle them with gloves. Definitely, a beauty for your garden.

If you have been using the re-use water, you may need to water your plants for awhile until the problem has been resolved.

## Off the Shelf - Book Review

# Grandma of the Glades; A Brief Biography of Marjory Stoneman Douglas by Marya Repko

The 7th Annual Marjory Stoneman Douglas Festival is being sponsored by the Friends of the Museum of the Everglades this week and so it is appropriate to discuss Marya Repko's new book about the life of one of our cherished crusaders of the Everglades, Marjory Stoneman Douglas. Many may wonder why the title "*Grandma* of the Glades" when Marjory had no children during her brief early marriage to Kenneth Douglas, a journalist in New Jersey. It was in 1993 that Marjory, at the age of 103, was given the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Bill Clinton called her the "Grandmother of the Glades"

This concise biography of Marjory is full of interesting bits of information about her early life, her parents, her move to Miami and her work as a writer, long before she became involved in the her passion to protect the Everglades from developers. It wasn't until she was 57 years old that *The Everglades: River of Grass* was published. Little did she realize that she would live another 50 years to continue her campaign.

This "brief" biography with historical photos captures all of those wonderful years and has a handy time-line on the back page to remind us of what else was happening. There is also a list of Further Reading and numerous footnote references.

Mary Jane Southwick Wallace, 81, of Naples, died on Friday, February 11, at Hospice House of Naples. Formerly of Louisville, KY, she had been a resident of Naples since 1984. She was the daughter of Lewis Arthur Southwick and Ruth Landis Weldon of Louisville. She graduated from Kentucky Home School for Girls, Louisville, KY in 1947, and from The Ward Belmont School in



Nashville, TN, in 1949 where she majored in pre-medical studies. She became a dental assistant following graduation. She was a "cradle Episcopalian" and a member of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Louisville. She was President of the Episcopal Women at St. Mark's for nine years and elected President of the Women of the Diocese of Kentucky 1970-73, served as Key Woman of the Fourth Province of the Episcopal Churchwomen, and delegate to three Triennial Meetings of the Church, 1967, 70, 73. She served a three year term on the Executive Council of the Diocese of Kentucky and was the first woman in the history of that diocese to sit on a committee to change Canon Law of the diocese in order to elect a bishop coadjutor. She became Assistant General Convention Manager of the Episcopal Church as Meeting Planner and Meetings Coordinator for the General Convention and the House of Bishops together with all the boards, agencies and committees of the Episcopal church 1972-83.

After moving to Naples in 1984 she became Manager of the Gulf Stream Club, a private bank of NCNB bank. She served a two year term of office as president of the Board of Directors of The Symphony Women of the Southwest Florida Symphony Orchestra and on the Board of Directors of the Orchestra 1987-89. She was elected to a three year term of office to the Board of Directors of St. Matthew's House in Naples. She also served as Secretary-Treasurer, Vice-President and President of the Greater Naples Ministerial Association 1997-99. She also served with her husband as an ordained minister to The Greystone Church, The Hitching Post Church and Lely Palms Retirement Community.

She is survived by her husband, The Rev. Dr. Bob N. Wallace, Pastor of Everglades Community Church; her three sons Lewis S. Taber, Paul C. Taber and Tom F. Taber; her three daughters Ruth A. Wilder (Gary), Bonnie L. Wallace and Christy T. Gordon) Anderson; her brothers George C. Southwick (Brenda), Ned B. Southwick (Penny); her two sisters Betty S. Jennings and Ruth W. Sams; ten grandchildren, one great grandchild; seven nieces and seven nephews; and many loving friends all over the world. She will be sorely missed.

Jane Wallace was a pastor's wife but she was also an ordained minister in the Episcopal Church herself and joined in local functions in that capacity.

A memorial service took place on February 14 at the Everglades Community Church. Fr. Tim Navin said she was a "person of faith" and that she thought "music was the voice of God". Pastor Morris Dantin said that he "thanked God that Jane crossed my path".

Our thoughts are with Pastor Bob Wallace who hinted at their close relationship in his novel *The Convention*.
