

CITY COUNCIL REPORT by Marya Repko

At the meeting on December 6, Mayor Sammy Hamilton welcomed newlyelected councilor MacBeth Collins who said it was good to be back again.

Before the meeting started officially, Doug House said that he had served as a Councilor under seven Mayors but the present one was the best one. The Mayor said he was proud to have restored this beautiful building (City Hall) which is part of everyone's history, not only in Everglades City but in all of Collier County.

The Mayor announced that after extensive negotiations with the DEP, the submerged land under the City docks now belongs to the City. He has also spoken to the attorney about the 53-acres tract near the airport about the dock that broke loose and the grass which needs to be cut.

Finally, the Mayor said he was looking forward to Santa's arrival and the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 16.





Recipe for Good Eating

Slow Cooker Shrimp & Sausage Jambalaya by Dana M. Bethea

Ingredients:

- 1 package Andouille sausage, diced
- ¹/₂ stick butter
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 2 tbs minced garlic
- 1 box Zataran's Jambalaya Mix
- 2 15oz cans diced tomatoes with juice

Directions:

- 1. Dice and brown sausage, set aside.

Off the Shelf – Book Review "Weeks Family Connections" "The Weeks from Massachusetts to The Everglades and Marco Island Florida" by Faye A. Brown

If you're a member of the Weeks family, here's a book that traces some of your ancestors. It was written by Faye A. Brown who is related to the original pioneer John Weeks. She grew up on Marco Island and remembers what it was like to live there in the 1940s and early 1950s. Besides researching the history, she collected stories from friends and family.

John Weeks was born in Beaufort, South Carolina, in 1821. After the Seminole Wars, he drifted southward, ending up in the Chokoloskee area where William Smith Allen found him farming on the bank of Potato Creek (now the Barron River) in 1868. John and his brother Madison later settled in Naples.

> Florida Tales Jet Engine Mystery by Chester Keene



On June 10, 2011, the story of the jet engine laying in a shallow bay off Chokoloskee was printed in hopes of finding any more facts about how it got there. I received two calls from residents of the Everglades and Chokoloskee area. One said he saw the plane when he was in high school in 1964; the other stated he thought it may have been around 1972. His version was the day after the crash. He stated the crew was ejected and picked up by helicopter. It appeared the crew was having engine trouble and pointed it out to sea and bailed out. The plane fell short of making it to open water and pancaked down hitting hard losing an engine and ended up in the top of mangrove trees. The witness to the after crash stated the military was loading the rest on barges but left the one engine. He stated he had old movies of his children standing on it but hasn't produced any and did not want to be named. The other witness was resident Bob Wells of Everglades. He said it was an F4 Phantom Jet. as did the other source. A research on the engine confirmed it was the type used in that aircraft. So far no word from the manufacturer GE. I'm still trying to get to the bottom of this. If you have any information or know who may, please call me at 239-649-0836. I will get back to you.

The Living Gulf Coast

Dusky Pigmy Rattlesnake (*Sistrurus miliarius barbouri*) **VENOMOUS!** Other names: ground rattlesnake, pigmy rattler, hog-nosed rattler / Status: FL = stable, IUCN = LC / Length: 18-30 in. (45-76 cm) / Weight: 5-6.5 oz (141-185 g) / Life span: to 20 years / Reproduces: live birth of 5-7 baby snakes, generally born in the spring / Found: All Counties, coastal, near coast, inland / Months found: **JFMAMJJASOND.**

The smallest venomous snake found in Florida, the pigmy rattlesnake's bite is seldom fatal. The record length for this diminutive rattler is a mere 30 inches, more than a foot shorter than the average length of a mature coral snake. Because



of its size, this pit viper delivers roughly 18 mg of venom, which, while extremely painful to the victim, is only a tenth of the amount delivered by an eastern diamondback rattlesnake. A handful of people have lost digits to these bites, but deaths are extremely rare. The same readily available anti-venom serum used for the eastern diamondback is used to treat pigmy rattler bites.

The pigmy rattlesnake is carnivorous, foraging primarily on green and brown anoles, cotton mice, and insects. It tends to strike its prey quickly, then withdraw and wait out the effects of its toxin. While most small rodents succumb quickly, some reptiles can escape, only to die 10 to 15 minutes later. This small pit viper is a fairly common sighting at Myakka River State Park, especially along the road in the fall when the first cold snaps leave the snake seeking the warmth of the pavement. Daddy, by this time most likely knew that our chances of seeing a Turkey would be slim, so when we saw a flock of brown Curlew, he shot a good mess of them for our dinner the next day. The loggers soon returned and we hitched a ride back with them to the horse pens where uncle Luby Kirkland kept his horses. Curlew is an Ibis and is white when it gets older. The brown Curlew is a young mature Ibis and, when fried up like chicken, the meat is very tender and makes for some very good eating. Mama cooked up a pot of rice and made a pan of good thick brown gravy to cover it with. A large pan of homemade buttermilk biscuits, with a large picture of sweetened ice tea, just set the meal off and it was "larruping" good! Now, I'm not advocating hunting Curlew, because it was then, and still is today, illegal! At the time, my family, who were pioneers of the area had learned to live off the land because there weren't a lot of jobs in the fifties. It was a means of survival!

While our daddy was cleaning the birds, our younger sister asked him what they were. Not wanting her to spread the word that we had Curlew, he told her they were Buzzards. She went back to school and when her first grade teacher asked her class to tell what they had for Thanksgiving dinner, she told them that she had eat Buzzard. Our mama was working in the school cafeteria at the time and the teacher told her what Glenda had told the class. Our mama had some explaining to do.

I can remember a few good times having Thanksgiving dinner at our grandma Weeks' house when we lived next door to her and the Kirkland family on Curtis Street in east Naples. Later, after our parents bought the "old Brown fish house" in Everglades City, Florida, our grandma went to live with them on the Barron River. We had several good Thanksgiving reunions there and celebrated with a large Turkey and all the trimmings. Our mama thought bigger was better. Everyone helped with the cooking. There were so many pies and cakes baked that it made it very difficult to choose. There were four generations of family celebrating the Holidays then.

As I approach seventy years of age, both my parents and grandparents are deceased. My husband and I moved to the North Georgia mountains, far removed from the family we have in Florida. Many have moved in other directions to different states. With the failing economy that we are experiencing and prices of gasoline sky rocketing; it makes it very difficult for families to reunite for special occasions.

This Thanksgiving I sat near my fireplace, alone, while my husband sits in a tree stand somewhere watching the deer. After contacting our children and grandchildren via Facebook, we enjoyed a meal of fried venison. fluffy white rice with some good brown gravy covering it. Sacrificing the biscuits, we now have a nice lettuce salad instead.

The cost of money just went down. On November 30, 2011, the

Federal Reserve and central banks from the Eurozone, England, Japan, Switzerland, and Canada announced their plan to make it less expensive for banks around the world to borrow U.S. dollars. Not surprisingly, markets reacted positively to the news, which is designed to boost liquidity and support the global economy.

If the European debt crisis escalates this plan allows central banks to offer liquidity in foreign currencies if necessary. At the same time, China announced a plan to increase liquidity by lowering its reserve requirement for financial institutions, freeing up funds to stimulate China's economy.


