We work with those who were sexually assaulted while on active duty and want to resolve any associated issues. Family members who suffer the loss of a service member on active duty are eligible for bereavement and grief counseling as well.

A core value of the Vet Center Program is to promote access to care by helping Veterans, service members, and families overcome barriers that impede them from using those services.

For example, all Vet Centers have available evening and/or weekend hours to help accommodate the schedules of Veterans, service members, and their families. 

SALES TAX HOLIDAY

If you are buying appliances that qualify, there will be no sales tax for three days, September 19-21, on the first \$1,500 of a new Energy Star or WaterSense product. The exemption is limited to a single purchase having a sales price of \$500 or more. There are no quantity limits on qualifying items with a sales price of less than \$500.

Recipe for Good Eating **TOMATOES**

I'm originally from Nashville and every year Middle Tennessee celebrates its number one crop – the tomato. I plant my own tomatoes here in Everglades City, but they don't last through the hot summer months, but I heard that Oakes Farms in Naples carries Tennessee tomatoes this time of year. There are several great recipes that I enjoy: the easiest, just slice them up and eat with just a little touch of salt; make a sandwich with mayo and salt and pepper; toss up a chopped tomato / avocado / onion salad with just oil and vinegar. For an hors d'oeuvres, toast a crusty slice of a baguette, spread with ricotta cheese, and top with roasted tomatoes, and crumbled crispy bacon. IRS Updates Phone Scams Warning

Protecting your privacy is a top priority at the IRS. The IRS uses social media tools to share public information, not to answer personal tax or account questions. You should never post your Social Security number or any other confidential information on social media sites.

The IRS is again warning the public about phone scams that continue to claim victims all across the country. In these scams, thieves make unsolicited phone calls to their intended victims. Callers fraudulently claim to be from the IRS and demand immediate payment of taxes by a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. The callers are often hostile and abusive.

To avoid becoming a victim of these scams, you should know:

- The IRS will first contact you by mail if you owe taxes, not by phone.
- The IRS never asks for credit, debit or prepaid card information over the phone.
 - The IRS never insists that you use a specific payment method to pay your tax.
- The IRS never requests immediate payment over the telephone.
- The IRS will always treat you professionally and courteously.

Scammers may tell would-be victims that they owe money and that they must pay what they owe immediately. They may also tell them that they are entitled to a large refund. Other characteristics of these scams include:

- Scammers use fake names and IRS badge numbers to identify themselves.
- Scammers may know the last four digits of your Social Security number.
- Scammers spoof caller ID to make the phone number appear as if the IRS is calling.
- Scammers may send bogus IRS emails to victims to support their bogus calls. •
- Victims hear background noise of other calls to mimic a call site. •
- After threatening victims with jail time or driver's license revocation, scammers hang up. Others soon call back pretending to be from the local police or DMV, and caller ID again supports their claim.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS, here's what to do:

- If you know you owe taxes or you think you might owe taxes, call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS employees can help you with a payment issue if you owe taxes.
- If you know you don't owe taxes or don't think that you owe any taxes, then call and report the incident to TIGTA at 800-366-4484.
- If scammers have tried this scam on you, you should also contact the Federal Trade Commission and use their "FTC Complaint Assistant" at FTC.gov. Please add "IRS Telephone Scam" to the comments of your complaint.

The IRS encourages you to be vigilant against phone and email scams that use the IRS as a lure. Visit the genuine IRS website, IRS.gov, to learn how to report tax fraud and for more information on what you can do to avoid becoming a victim.

Fishing Report by Captain Bill Lindsay

Snook season opens and I can't wait to catch one in the slot and enjoy my first snook dinner of the year. Fish along the beaches and passes where you can find

moving water. Sight casters comb the shore lines in tight and approach these fish quietly and cast jigs, top water plugs or even flies to them. While you're catching snook, you're in prime redfish territory so kill two birds with one stone, as they say. Baby tarpon are being caught in small remote creeks at the top of the bays. Black drum and trout are still moving around in the backcountry and out front along the beaches. Offshore, red grouper, Spanish mackerel, permit and cobia could be found on any wreck or rock pile. In short, September is a great month to enjoy this area.

In the winter of 1917, Dr. Henry Nehrling, a botanist from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, suffered a devastating loss at his Palm Cottage Gardens located in Gotha, Florida (20 miles west of

Cottage Gardens located in Gotha, Florida (20 miles west of Orlando) because of an exceptionally cold winter. Looking to find a frost-free climate, he purchased some agricultural acreage in Southwest Florida and began planting thousands of tropical plants. Many of his original plants can still be found on the grounds of Caribbean Gardens today. Sadly, after Dr. Nehrling's death in 1929, his gardens went unattended for years, and many of his prime specimens were lost. Julius Fleischmann, heir to the Fleischmann's Yeast and Standard Brands fortune, discovered what was left of the gardens on his first visit to Naples in 1946. After purchasing the land, he began restoring the gardens in 1952. Two years later Caribbean Gardens, complete with parrot shows, was opened to the public.

In 1967 Col. Lawrence and Nancy Jane Tetzlaff, a colorful couple known in Cedar Point, Ohio, as Jungle Larry and Safari Jane, came to Naples in search of a warmer climate for their private collection of exotic animals. After Julius Fleischmann's death a year later, his heirs contacted the Tetzlaffs to see if they would lease Caribbean Gardens for their animals. The creative merger was renamed Naples Zoo at Caribbean Gardens, and on September 1, 1969, once again was opened to the public. For the next 33 years the zoo continued its mission, which is still exemplified by a 1970 quote by Jungle Larry, "Conservation is the name of the game." In 2002, the Fleischmann estate decided to put the 43-acre park and 120 surrounding acres on the market. With Naples real estate hitting record highs, the asking price for the property was, at least for the Tetzlaffs, a prohibitive \$67.5 million. The Tetzlaff family turned to the city of Naples and Collier County for help. After a public referendum on the purchase passed with a record 73 percent voter approval, the county purchased all of the land. The Tetzlaffs remained in charge of the operation, and with Jungle Larry's passing in 1984, his two sons, David and Tim, along with a host of zookeepers and staff, keep the vision of the zoo alive and flourishing.

Today, the Naples Zoo is in the top 10 percent of the nation's zoos accredited by the prestigious Association of Zoos and Aquariums. Its grounds are home to many rare and fascinating animals. While the Naples Zoo has long been renowned for its extensive lemur collection (including brown, red-fronted, white-fronted, and ring-tailed), it also hosts the lemur's top predator, the fosa (Cryptoprocta ferox; aka fossa) of Madagascar. This cat-like animal looks like a strange cross between a miniature panther and a jaguarundi. The zoo has an extensive snake and reptile exhibit, including many venomous snakes such as copperheads, cottonmouths, and canebrake, diamondback, and Massasauga rattlesnakes. *This article is to be continued*
