

CITY COUNCIL REPORT

by Marya Repko Mayor Sammy Hamilton reported at the meeting on January 12 that he is busy getting a huge grant to rebuild our waste water plant. As he said, "We are a small city but we are a strong and powerful city."

The Mayor then praised Lt. Mark Milligan, who is retiring at the end of the month after 13 years as head of CCSO District 7. The Mayor presented him with a plaque in gratitude. The Lieutenant replied that



he appreciated the cooperation he'd received from all the community which allowed amazing things to be accomplished during his term here. There was a standing ovation for Lt. Mark.

Councilor Elaine Middelstaedt thanked Lt. Mark and his team for the "fabulous" things they'd done in the community. Councilors McBeth Collins and Parker Oglesby added their praise. Councilor Howie Grimm especially thanked the Sheriff's Office for the youth programs.

John M. Wilson, during Public Comment, asked that the "No Trucks / No Buses" sign on North Storter Avenue be made more legible to stop big vehicles from using the road as a shortcut.

The Mayor mentioned that the colored lights from the tower on the circle had been vandalized and that he was offering a \$500 reward for help in catching the person who darkened our traditional display.



# Recipe for Good Eating Cottage Cheese Pancakes

Ingredients: 1 cup cottage cheese

2 level tablespoons of whole wheat flour (or white flour)2 tablespoons of oil (safflower or canola)

3 eggs

Mix all the ingredients together in a blender or cuisinart, and add fruit as desired before cooking. We always cooked them on a griddle over a burner on the stove, but any flat nonstick pan would work. We added butter to the pan before cooking to keep them from sticking, and flipped them as soon as they began to bubble on the uncooked side. They cook quickly, and it's easy to size up the recipe for a larger group of people by simply doubling the ingredients.

Note from Nathaniel: I remember eating these (many of them) when I was a kid, and I have very fond memories of them. We used to make them with blueberries, raspberries, strawberries or peaches. They are very thin, and not at all doughy. It's a simple recipe and there are only four ingredients, which is helpful for people like me that are challenged in the kitchen. Enjoy!

# Living Gulf Coast

**Roseate Spoonbill** (*Platalea ajaja*) Other names: pink curlew, pink / Status:

FL=species of special concern, IUCN=LC / Life span: to 15 years / Length: 30-40 in. (76-101 cm) / Wingspan: 50-53 in. (127-135 cm) / Weight: 2.54 lb (1.13-1.81 kg) / Nests: in remote rookeries throughout SW Florida / Found: AC, coastal, near coast / Months found: JFmamJJASOnd (lower case indicates nesting and breeding season).



Without question, the roseate spoonbill is the poster child of bird lovers. A difficult bird to add to anyone's life list, the roseate is commonly found in this area year round and thus attracts thousands of avid birders annually to the islands.



Because of its pink coloration, the roseate is sometimes mistakenly confused with the flamingo. Unmistakable for its spatulate bill, bald head and flamboyant pink coloration, the roseate was nearly extirpated from Florida during the 1800s. Not only was it taken by the plume hunters, it was also killed for its meat, and its rookeries were repeatedly raided for eggs. Now recovering, the numbers of these lovely birds are still only a fraction of what they were when Ponce de Leon first landed in Florida. The roseate's feeding style is unique, similar to wood storks. It swishes its spatula-shaped bill back and forth through the soft, exposed muck of a tidal flat. When it comes across a shrimp or crustacean, it claps its bill together, eating the prey, then quickly resumes feeding. It also has a unique behavior called "skypointing" where it extends its bill and neck upward toward other spoonbills flying overhead.

The roseate is monogamous and tends to nest with other wading birds. Its nests are sometimes raided by raccoons and other predators. It needs extensive tidal flats to survive, and it suffers from polluted waters, as well as long-term habitat loss.

# TAXING THINGS

## **NEW FOR THE NEW YEAR**

Following a review of the tax extenders legislation signed into law last month, the Internal Revenue Service announced the nation's tax season will begin on Tuesday, Jan. 19. The IRS began accepting all business tax returns on January 9, except for the Form 94x which began on January 11.

The IRS reminds taxpayers that the quickest way to get a copy of their tax transcript is to order it online using the Get Transcript application on IRS.gov. By planning ahead, they should receive their transcript in the mail within five to 10 days from the time the IRS receives the request online.

The Internal Revenue Service issued the 2016 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on January 1, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) are:

54 cents per mile for business miles driven, down from 57.5 cents for 2015

19 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes, down from 23 cents for 2015 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations

# LOCAL HISTORY PARK ANNIVERSARIES

This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the National Park Service which was signed into law by President Woodrow Wilson on August 25, 1916.

And, it is also the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of what became Everglades National Park, thanks to some determined women in the Florida Federation of Women's Clubs who created a park at Paradise Key, also called Royal Palm Hammock. If it were not for May Mann Jennings and her political clout (her husband William Sherman Jennings had been governor of Florida 1901-1904), the ages-old trees might have been cut down so that the land could be farmed or developed.

In 1934 enabling legislation for Everglades National Park, which includes Royal Palm Hammock, was passed by Congress, thanks to Ruth Bryan Owen (the first woman from Florida to be elected as a Representative). However, World War II intervened and it was not until 1947 that President Harry S Truman pronounced the formal opening at a ceremony in Everglades City with our own Deaconess Harriet Bedell giving the invocation.




Off the Shelf – Book Review Miss Dreamsville and the Lost Heiress of Collier County by Amy Hill Hearth

In her second novel set during the 1960s in the Naples area, the author tackles the problem of development. Will unscrupulous businessmen, with money from outside, pave over paradise?

The zany gang of gals who also featured in the previous book (*see Rapper, 6/21/09*) include the Turtle Lady, Plain Jane, upper crust Mrs. B-W, and flamboyant radio star Miss Dreamsville. They are joined by a former feisty stripper who now hunts gators from her shack in the swamp on a river estuary where the new condos are being planned.



The book includes good descriptions of the Glades and poses the "jobs vs. environment" question. It's a good read, funny but with a serious message and lots of local color when Naples was still a remote rural southern town. The old Courthouse and its history in Everglades City is mentioned with an acknowledgement at the end to the Friends of the Museum of the Everglades!

# Pioneering Women, 100 Years Ago

A century ago, the first woman to be Mayor of a city in Florida was Marian O'Brien who was elected in 1916 when the little town of Moore Haven, west of Lake Okeechobee, was incorporated. Included in its statutes was the right to vote for women - three years before Amendment 19 was passed in 1919.

Marian was a competent business woman who took over her husband's holdings in remote Florida after he suddenly passed away. She created a bank, a hotel, and other amenities for the new town. She then went on to help found Clewiston and the sugar industry there.

You can read more about this amazing woman who achieved so much in those early days in the new book "*Women in the Everglades*" which describes some of the brave pioneers who lived on the fringes of the River of Grass, from Miami to Sanibel and parts in-between.


