

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Florída Tales "1892 Everglades Exploring Expedition"

by Chester Keene continued from Aug.28, 2015,issue....



Soundings made during the day showed from 3-5 feet of mud all underlaid with hard rock. In the saw grasses the bottom could not always be found with a five foot pole. Mud was everywhere today, little if any sand could be felt with the feet. Reclaimed, it would be very rich land. The richest we have yet seen, says our engineer. Saw grass to the southward almost continuous, as far as the eye could see looking from 15-20 feet elevation. Water averaged for the day 1.2 feet, except on saw grasses where it averaged .2 of a foot only. Our Indian Billy Fiewel did not turn up tonight as agreed. Fresh Indian signs were seen by Mr. Newman who arrived ahead of the party an hour or two before sunset, so he may have come and seeing our saw grass fires to the south and west of the island, concluded we were too far off the course for him to bother about us. The glades at this point present an endless sea of saw and other grasses. The 2 miles of packing from the boat where we left them was the boggiest marsh and saw grass imaginable and all hands were thoroughly tired out when we reached Camp No,5,Island No.23.We are 92,750 feet from Fort Shackleford tonight on our course. to be continued...

TAXING THINGS by Mike, The Tax Guy Oops!

The IRS has begun mailing follow-up letters to taxpayers noting that the Identity Protection (IP) PIN they received in a prior mailing is valid despite the incorrect reference to the year. Please be aware the IP PIN listed on the CP 01A notice dated Jan. 4, 2016, is valid for use on individual tax returns filed in 2016. The earlier notice incorrectly indicates the IP PIN issued is to be used for filing the 2014 tax return when it should be used for the 2015 tax return.

U.S Treasury offers myRA, a Free No-Fee, Retirement Savings Option

In November, the Treasury Department launched myRA, a new, simple way to open a starter retirement account. myRA has no fees, and participants can fund their myRA accounts through:

• Payroll deduction. Set up automatic direct deposit contributions to myRA through an employer.

• Checking or savings account. Savers can also fund a myRA account directly by setting up recurring or one-time contributions from a checking or savings account.

• Federal tax refund. At tax time, you may direct all or a portion of a federal tax refund to your myRA account.

Who Can Represent You Before the IRS?

Many people use a tax professional to prepare their taxes. Tax professionals with an IRS Preparer Tax Identification Number (PTIN) can prepare a return for a fee. Limited representation rights authorize the tax professional to represent you if, and only if, they prepared and signed the return. For returns filed after Dec. 31, 2015, the only tax return preparers with limited representation rights are Annual Filing Season Program Participants.

Fishing Report

February In The Ten Thousand Islands: Well winter finally made it to south Florida and water temps dropped enough to get the winter bite going. We have been catching lots of Seatrout on the grass flats. Fish a live shrimp or a DOA shrimp on

a popping cork for the Trout. The Black Drum have also been biting extremely well. These fish can also be caught on shrimp. Redfish are still abundant and they are being caught in the islands and in the back country. Fish shrimp or a jig for the Reds. Tip the jig with some shrimp to increase the bites. Fish the incoming tide around the islands for the Redfish and the Black Drum. These have been biting best on the lower water. Sheepshead have been biting really good too and Mangrove Snapper seem to be everywhere. Snook fishing in the back country is still good as well. I have been using soft plastic lures fished close to the mangroves. White DOA Baitbuster mullet fished really slow are a great way to go. You can also fish out on the edges of the flats and catch Mackerel, Bluefish, and Pompano. There will be a lot of variety this month and the weather should be pleasant but cool. A great time to get the novice angler out and have lots of action! Good Luck Fishing, Capt. Mike Merritt

Living Gulf Coast

Anhinga (Anhinga anhinga) Other names: snakebird, water turkey, darter / Status: FL=stable, IUCN=LC / Life span: Life span: to 11 years / Length: 30-37 in. (75-95 cm) / Wingspan: 45-48 in. One of the most photographed birds in

Florida, the anhinga can be seen at almost any time of the day along canals and drainage ditches, drying its wings. The name anhinga, which comes from the Tupi-speaking natives of the Amazon basin, means "evil spirit of the woods." Locally it is often referred to as the snakebird because of its ability to swim through the water with only its long, snakelike neck exposed.

When in full breeding plumage, the male anhing a sports a stunning black and white neck, back, and forewings that resemble piano keys. The female has a brown neck and breast. Because of its similar size and feeding habits, the anhinga is easily confused with the cormorant. Unlike the cormorant, however, the anhinga is an excellent flyer and can sometimes be seen soaring with wood storks and vultures high above the peninsula.

The anhinga, a distant relative of the pelican, has evolved a unique style of fishing. Unlike the cormorant and most diving ducks, the anhinga has no natural oils in its feathers. That, coupled with its dense bone structure, allows the anhinga to sink once its feathers become saturated with water. Also unlike the cormorant, the anhinga seldom grasps its prey but instead impales the pinfish or sand trout on its sharply pointed, dagger-like beak which it uses to impale the unfortunate fish. The anhinga carefully flips the minnow off of its beak, eventually working its way around to its mouth where it swallows the minnow whole. Its unusual perching behavior, with its large wings spread wide open, occurs because the anninga becomes completely waterlogged after fishing. Sometimes, when startled and still too wet to fly, the anhinga will tumble back into the water creating a loud, unexpected splash. Although its principal diet is fish, the anhinga has been known to eat baby alligators, water snakes, leeches, and frogs. Monogamous and colonial, it often nests with egrets and herons. Aside from alligators and great horned owls, the anhinga has few natural predators.



LOCAL HISTORY Everglades Community Church - 90th Anniversary by Marya Repko

A Presbyterian congregation was established in 1926 for residents of the Everglades area. Services were held in various locations around the town such as Club Everglades, the community center that also showed films. By 1939 it was decided that a permanent location was needed and the Collier interests gave land to the church on condition that the building be finished by 1940 and that the church be non-denominational.

Various improvements were made over the years after that and the Fellowship Hall at the rear was added in 1957. More recently, the complete building has been renovated under the leadership of Pastor Bob Wallace.



In 2008 the vinyl siding was removed, revealing decorative arches over the front windows. The interior of the sanctuary was enlarged and stained glass windows, donated by members, were installed. Finally, the Fellowship Hall was completely modernized thanks to a bequest by Louise Collier Jinkins who had joined the church in 1937 and continued to attend until her passing in 2010.

A celebration was held to mark the 90th Anniversary on Sunday, January 24, with the issue of an historical booklet, posters of photos, and a video.

Off the Shelf – Book Review "Hey, God? Yes, Charles, Conversations on Life, Loss and Love"

Some people say that everything that happens to us in life is for a purpose. That is hard to accept when we lose a loved one who is (relatively speaking) much too young.

Somehow, though, I don't believe my chance meeting with Becky Cooper at Ladies

Coffee a few weeks ago was without a purpose. I arrived late and the only available seat was right next to her. This was Becky's first visit to Everglades City; her long-time friend Nina Armstrong had been coming here for years and from our introductions I learned that they were from the Nashville area (my home town) and Nina's older sister had been a patient of my father's. So, we had an immediate connection, and the southern ladies that we are, we didn't stop talking. It was from our conversation that morning that I learned of Becky's loss in 2007 of her husband, a healthy 58-year-old who had an underlying heart condition that took his life, so unexpectedly that it took Becky years to recover. She was angry with God and lonely; she and Charles had been high school sweethearts and married for 38 years.



As Becky explains it, during the months following Charles' passing, she would hear conversations between him and God. We all handle loss of a loved one in different ways, many of us continuing that close connection after the death. Becky would just write down on scraps of paper what she was experiencing and those little notes evolved into this heartrending book which a friend encouraged her to share with others. All of us can relate to her words and suffering but few can express it with such humor (strange word but true) and simplicity. Thank you, Becky. NPS is seeking public comments from now to **March 11** on preliminary alternatives for managing backcountry access and use within Big Cypress and also receive public input related to the development of a wilderness study and potential wilderness proposal. Commercial Air Tours over Big Cypress

The FAA, the NPS, and two commercial air tour operators (Wings & Miami Seaplane Tours, Inc.) have signed air tour management agreements to manage commercial air tours over Big Cypress National Preserve. These are the first-ever agreements of this kind developed for any unit of the NPS. The agreements establish conditions for conducting air tours, including specific routes, altitudes, number of flights, type of aircraft, hours of operations, and reporting requirements. Wings has been providing air tours over the preserve for many years under interim operating authority from FAA for up to 1,260 tours annually; the new agreement now authorizes up to 720 tours a year. The agreement with Miami Seaplane Tours, Inc., a new operator over the preserve, authorizes up to 252 tours a year. The agreements will be fully implemented when the FAA updates the operating specifications for each operator within 90 days of Dec. 21, 2015, the date of final signatures.


