### **Snook Season Reopens September 1st**



The harvest season for Snook, the delicious, and often times, elusive fish, reopens on September 1st south of Gordon Pass in Collier County.

The season will remain closed north of the Pass into Hernando/Pasco county as that region recovers from the effects of Red Tide.

Snook harvest is permitted in the Everglades City/ Chokoloskee area. Anglers must possess a saltwater fishing license and snook stamp.

The fish have a slot limit. Snook must not be less than 28" or more than 33". There is a limit of 1 fish per day with a zero captain and crew-for-hire limit.

Snook are frequently caught near the mangroves where there is moving water.

Many anglers will use live bait and some prefer artificial lures.

There are multiple bait shops in our area that can advise you on the proper baits to use. If you prefer to go on an adventure with a professional guide, you can find several in the Everglades area.

Most importantly, have a great time fishing and catching!



JFMAMJJASoND Pelicans breed all year except October.

As you travel up and down the coast, it is impossible not to spot this large, easily recognized bird feeding on the threadfin herring and glass minnows that gather along the shoreline and in the shadows cast by the numerous bridges ferrying you across to the barrier islands. What is harder to grasp is that the ubiquitous brown pelican was fast approaching extinction in the 1960s and '70s.



Widespread use of DDT to control the Florida mosquito population altered the calcium metabolism in pelicans and other birds, causing them to produce eggs with shells too thin to support the embryo to maturity. In nearby Louisiana (where, ironically, the pelican is the state bird) the population completely collapsed because of the overuse of these pesticides. Louisiana had to import Florida pelicans through the 1980s to help rebuild its decimated flocks. Today, they are once again rebounding from yet another manmade disaster, the Deepwater Horizon oil spill.

The brown pelican is the smallest of the seven species of pelicans in the world. The only other indigenous North American species is the American white pelican, a common winter resident of Southwest

Florida. The largest pelican in the world is the Australian pelican, which can weigh more than 22 pounds (10 kilograms).

The brown pelican is unique among these species in that it is the only one that dives for its prey. The brown pelican hovers from heights of 20 to 60 feet, then collapses its wings and plunges headfirst into the water, filling its pouch with a combination of minnows and saltwater. A fully extended pouch can hold almost three gallons of water. As the bird strains out the excess water, terns and gulls flock around hoping to pick off some of the outflow.

The brown pelican is especially vulnerable to water quality. Excessive nutrient runoff and the resulting harmful algae blooms can cause severe declines in minnow populations. With each pelican chick requiring 150 pounds (67 kilograms) of fish over the eight-month nesting period, an entire breeding season can be lost to environmental degradation. The brown pelican nests in large colonies, generally on remote and smaller uninhabited mangrove islands.

Predation occurs mostly to the eggs and nestlings from raccoons, opossums, bobcats, snakes, fish crows, and exotics such as Nile monitor lizards. Adults may be taken by sharks and alligators, though rarely. Coastal development, pollution, and pesticides are the pelican's primary threats. **Photo of diving pelicans by Rob Pailes.**

# TAXING THINGS by Mike the Tax Guy

#### Attention teachers: Those school expenses might be tax deductible!

School may look a little different this year, but eligible teachers and other educators can still deduct certain unreimbursed expenses on their tax return next year.

#### Who is considered an eligible educator:

The taxpayer must be a kindergarten through grade 12 teacher, instructor, counselor, principal or aide. They must also work at least 900 hours a school year in a school that provides elementary or secondary education as determined under state law.

#### Things to know about this deduction:

Educators can deduct up to \$250 of trade or business expenses that were not reimbursed. As teachers prepare for the school year, they should remember to keep receipts after making any purchase to support claiming this deduction.

The deduction is \$500 if both taxpayers are eligible educators and file their return using the status married filing jointly. These taxpayers cannot deduct more than \$250 each.

Qualified expenses are amounts the taxpayer paid themselves during the tax year.

#### **Examples of expenses the educator can deduct include:**

- **♦** Professional development course fees
- ♦ Books
- **♦** Supplies
- ♦ Computer equipment, including related software and services
- ♦ Other equipment and materials used in the classroom

#### Four Critical Needs for Kids Learning at Home

Parents whose children (or child) are working from home can face some unanticipated challenges. Fortunately (or unfortunately) many parents already got a taste of online learning when schools were closed in late March.

However, starting a new school year means new teachers, new curriculum and an entire new set of challenges for schools and families.

The website TeachThought.com provides numerous resources for teachers and parents in the era of Covid-19 learning. One of the most critical aspects of e-learning is to provide an environment conducive to learning. Here are their top 4 recommendations:

- 1. Set (and keep) a schedule: The closer this is to a 'school schedule,' the easier it will likely be on everyone. You obviously can (and probably should) revise whatever you come up with at first to fit your circumstance at home (your work schedule, sleeping schedules, etc.). But once you've got something that works, stick to it. And this almost certainly means to use some sort of timer to at least clarify how much time is being spent on what.
- 2. Make sure they have any materials necessary to complete all assignments: Whether its pencil and paper, a stable WiFi connection, log-in information for all accounts, a PDF reader, or note-taking apps or reading strategies—whatever they need to get the work done.
- **3. Provide an environment conducive to learning:** This isn't always easy. If they're too isolated, it's difficult to check in with them. If they're at the kitchen table, depending on the child or their environment, they may be too distracted. This is even more challenging when everyone is home and the house is full. Background noise can help, as can music.
- **4. Create a daily plan:** Creating a daily plan isn't just a matter of scheduling. A daily plan looks at the schedule and then identifies to-do items for that day and combines the two for a specific plan for that specific day.







#### \*\*\*Safeguard Your Home's Title!\*\*\* New County Program Helps Protect Home With Simple Signup

On Monday, August 10, Collier County Clerk of the Circuit Court and Comptroller Crystal K. Kinzel was presented with a certificate appreciation from Collier County Sheriff Kevin Rambosk, in recognition of her innovative and proactive approach to combatting identity theft and fraud in Collier County by providing citizens with the free Risk Alert Notification Program. "By providing the Risk Alert Notification Service to property owners, Clerk Kinzel has given our residents a means to easily monitor their property records for fraudulent activity," said "This is a significant Rambosk. contribution in our efforts to combat identify theft and fraud in Collier County, and Clerk Kinzel and her team are to be commended.'

Earlier this year, the Collier Clerk's Office launched the Risk Alert Notification Program, which is a free service designed to help property owners monitor and protect their property records from property fraud. Property fraud can be committed in a number of ways when a scammer files a phony property document, such as a deed, to make it appear as if they own property that is not theirs, and then they often deceive people into giving them money to buy or rent the property, or deceive banks into giving them a loan.

Subscribers to the Risk Alert Notification Program will receive an email alert if a deed, mortgage or other record matching the subscriber's name is recorded in the Official Records of Collier County. Subscribers can then determine whether the activity was legitimately initiated, or if a scammer is committing fraud. If fraud did occur, the subscriber can quickly take the next steps with law enforcement agencies.

Over 800 residents and businesses have already subscribed to the free service.
