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Dead Sawfish Shows Illegal Trade is Still a Big Problem

The disturbing news that 7 endangered smalltooth sawfish were found dead alongside the causeway between Everglades City and Chokoloskee is a stark reminder that illegal trade for the fish's rostrum (the "saw") is still an international problem.

According to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) a market still exists for the rostrum and fins for use as a novelty item for display, as "teeth" used in cockfighting in parts of South America, and as treatments in some traditional medicines.

Earlier this year, it was suggested that the rare pangolin, the "scaled" anteater native to parts of Africa, that was illegally exported from Africa into China may be responsible for the initial transmission of Covid-19 to humans from the animal.

In June 2020, China banned sale of pangolin at markets in China in an attempt to dry up demand for the animal lowering its trade value.

At home and abroad much more needs to be done to stop the illegal trade of endangered wildlife.

Applying pressure to our international trade partners whose country is on the receiving end of the illegal trade is a good place to start.

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Seven Dead Small Sawtooth Sawfish Dumped Along Canal in Everglades City There is a \$25,000 Reward for Information Submitted by NOAA

NOAA's Office of Law Enforcement is conducting an investigation involving the deaths of seven critically endangered smalltooth sawfish in Everglades City, Fla. An employee with Everglades National Park reported the dead sawfish and two dead bonnethead sharks to NOAA experts. Two of the sawfish are missing their rostra (saws). One other had its meat removed, leaving only the carcass.

The animals were found along the causeway between Everglades City and Chokoloskee Island, Fla. A sawfish biologist from the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission will perform a necropsy on the animals to try to determine the cause of death.

Smalltooth sawfish are listed as endangered under the Endangered Species Act. They were once found in the Gulf of Mexico from Texas to Florida and along the East Coast from Florida to North Carolina. Their distribution has decreased greatly in U.S. waters over the past century. Today, the species is generally only found off the coast of Florida, especially southwest Florida where sawfish give birth. They reproduce every other year and give birth to just 7-14 young. The loss of these six animals is nearly equivalent to one mother's entire litter.



NOAA officials seek information from anyone who may have details about this incident and are offering a reward up to \$20,000 for information leading to a criminal conviction or the assessment of a civil penalty. The Center for Biological Diversity announced an additional \$5,000 reward, increasing the overall reward to \$25,000.

Smalltooth sawfish were added on the Endangered Species List in 2003. Killing a sawfish is a Class-A misdemeanor, punishable by up to a year in prison and a fine of up to \$100,000.

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Fishing in the 10,000 Islands by Captain Mike Merritt



Fall is definitely in the air! This past week those NE winds were blowing the tide out and it's a precursor of things to come. For those that do not have a lot of local knowledge it pays to be cautious. I saw at least a half dozen boats run aground this past week. Not only can it be costly to the boat owner but it causes some pretty good damage to the bottom. Running over grasses or

oyster bars may not seem like a big deal, but multiply that by all the boat traffic over the year and you can see my point. Please be careful!

Despite the challenging tides and winds the fishing has remained strong. Lots of Redfish still being caught all the way down the coast. These are most active on a rising tide. They are being caught on just about every bait there is. From jigs to live baits and of course shrimp. Bottom rigs and corks are both working and it pays to mix it up so you can find out their preference at any particular spot. More of these fish should start making their way into the back country as water temps continue to drop.

Snook fishing is still strong with large numbers of smaller Snook being caught. Its great to see this and hopefully the Snook had another good spawn this year! We have been catching plenty of slot fish and even some oversize beauties. Live baits are working great but jigs and sub surface lures are catching plenty. Outgoing and incoming tides are producing. It seems as long as you have some current the fish are biting. November is the last month of Snook season till next March so if your looking for a Snook dinner time is running out.

Tarpon are still being caught and we have hooked some real big fish this past week. The rivers seem to be full of smaller fish but there are some big fish passing thru. Most of the big fish I have hooked have been on the outside. We have been using live baits for these but you never know when you will get one on while Snook fishing!

The weather and fishing are great so whatever you decide to do should be enjoyable. Even the Seatrout are showing back up in good numbers! So enjoy the great fishing and respect our surroundings! We can enjoy another lifetime of what we have. Good luck fishing!

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

Abandoned Hotel at Port of the Islands Will Be Torn Down by County

The abandoned hotel at the Port of the Isles will be torn down by Collier County.

After years of unpaid taxes litigation, Collier County took ownership of the property after no buyer surfaced for the property three years after the published

The eyesore along US41 is now the county's responsibility and they intend on tearing the building down.

The county received eight bids for the removal of the building, including asbestos removal. The project will cost the county \$388,444 to demolish the building, dispose of the debris and grade and level the parcel. The county has no immediate plans for the parcel.

The Island Kitchen

Easy Beef Stroganoff by Kathy Brock

1 pound slice filet mignon (or other tender beef)

1 bag (12 oz) extra wide noodles

1 large onion, diced

3 stalks celery, diced

1/2 lb. sliced mushrooms

1 tbs Worcestershire sauce

1/2 cup sour cream

2 cups water

3 beef bouillon cubes (can use beef broth or other beef base)

1 tbs fresh garlic

1/4 tsp sage & rosemary (optional but good!)

1 tbs olive oil

1/4 cup flour for thickening

Cook noodles drain and blend in 1 tbs of butter and set aside.

In a large skillet, sauté onions, celery and mushrooms in olive oil until tender. Remove and set aside. Thinly slice and brown meat, add the cooked onions, celery and mushrooms and cover with water. Add bouillon, herbs and Worcestershire sauce, and bring to a boil. In a bowl, mix flour with some water and dissolve. Slowly add to skillet and cook until thickened. Add more if you want it thicker. Remove from heat and stir in sour cream until blended. Serve over noodles.
