Update from City Hall

The November 28 City Council meeting dealt with several housekeeping issues before the election results were announced. To comply with State law, last fiscal year's budget was amended

to reflect the balanced result. The ordinances dealing with Wastewater plant hookups and Airboat operations were extended until the plant construction and negotiations with the South Florida Water Management District are completed.

After a brief recess Supervisor of Elections, Melissa Blazier, announced the results of the election for Mayor and City Council and Charter amendments as follows

Visions of the Bank Building



On November 17 we welcomed over 40 people to see and hear what architect Rick Gonzalez, REG Architects, has planned for the old Bank of Everglades.

Rick opened his talk by saying what a "unique, very special place" Everglades City is and mentioned its "wonderful city plan with a circle in the middle" thanks to the foresight of Barron Collier's team.

Besides the Visitor Center, our building will have mostly open space to provide multipurpose use as a gathering place for events and art shows on the ground floor. He praised the "really cool vault" that will screen films for small groups. Upstairs will have rooms for our office with historical archives and for meetings or classes.

The presentation included an illustration of plantings envisioned by local landscape architect Dayna Fendrick of Urban Green Studios in Naples.

But, it will be at least a year before that finishing touch can be completed. We first have to shore up the foundations and replace the windows with replicas of the originals.

Our thanks to Rick and Dayna for speaking to us, to Sherry Geiger and Debbie Dowacter for the delicious food and to Everglades Isle for hosting this event.



Norman A. Herren ... A Life of Service

"When I first came to Everglades, back in 1938, I thought it was one of the most beautiful spots I had ever seen," recalled Norman Herren, decades after a lifetime of service to Collier County and Florida.

As a native Floridian, born in Miami on December 11, 1914, he was a natural steward of the Land of Flowers. The Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration he earned in 1937 from the University of Miami opened the door the following year to a lifelong career with the enterprises of Barron G. Collier, committed to "putting all improved land to its best possible use under good management practices."

It was when Herren joined the Collier team as administrative assistant

to engineer D. Graham Copeland, general manager of the Collier Companies, that he discovered they shared a passion for historic research about the land which became Collier County. Together with Copeland, he said in a 1976 Naples Daily News interview, they translated early Spanish documents and interviewed pioneer settlers. Herren typed what became known as The Copeland Papers, six volumes of 1,820 single-spaced legal-size pages of the early history of Collier County

Herren succeeded Copeland after his retirement from the Collier Companies in 1947 and for most of his tenure there was vice-president. By 1976 he was a board member of six Collier companies and the chief executive officer of five. He felt very strongly about the protection of the state's land, citing the Collier Companies' greatest accomplishment was setting aside land for preservation.

In 1958, the Florida Forest Service established the reforestation seedling Herren Nursery. Located on the Tamiami Trail, eight miles south of Punta Gorda, this state nursery cultivated about five million slash pine seedlings a year which were sold at cost, \$10 per thousand, to landowners and to Collier County 4-H Clubs.

In 1974, the nursery produced about 305,000 Eucalyptus seedlings, about 300,000 "tropicals" annually, and in 1980 shipped more than

one million container-grown seedlings. Although not the first to ship seedlings in boxes, the Herren Nursery is believed to have been the first to pack extracted seedlings, seedlings wrapped in bundles and boxed several hundred to a box.

The Herren Nursery was converted to a container nursery in 1973 and was relocated in 1977 to Lake Placid, Florida.

As vice-president of the Florida Board of Forestry in 1956, Norman Herren served his state. He served the citizens of Collier County, mostly simultaneously, as:

President: the Greater Naples Area Chamber of Commerce, the Blood Bank of Collier County, the Collier County Unit of the American Cancer Society, the Collier County Parks and Recreation Board, the Naples Lions Club, the Everglades Chamber of Commerce, the Collier County Cattlemen's Association, and the 1973 Collier County Semi-Centennial Committee.

Vice-president: the Collier County District of the Historical Association of Southern Florida, the Manhattan Mercantile Corporation, the Collier County Historical Society, and the Collier County Chapter of the American Cancer Society.

Chairman: the Collier County Coastal Area Planning Commission, the Collier County Tuberculosis Association, the Collier County Board of Public Instruction, the Agriculture Committee of the Naples Chamber of commerce, the Collier County Civil Defense Unit, the Southwest Florida Council of Boy Scouts-Collier District, and the Collier County Zoning Board

Director: the Collier County Taxpayers League, the First National Bank of Naples, the Bank of Everglades, Citizens National Bank of Naples, and the Naples Civic Association.

Member of the following boards: the Collier County Planning Board, the Naples Memorial Hospital founding board, Naples Community Hospital Board of Trustees Secretary, the Joint County-City Water Conservation Committee, the Naples Cruise Club, the Collier County Forest Fire Prevention Committee, the Collier-Seminole State Park Advisory Council, and the United Fund of Collier County.

Norman Herren served as City Manager of Everglades City and as the parent of Judith and Norman, Jr. he served as an officer of the Everglades Parent-Teacher Association when they were students. The Barron Collier Corporation relocated its offices to Naples on November 1, 1960 and Herren and his wife Jane followed suit in 1961.

In addition to Norman A. Herren's service to his state and his community, as a lieutenant in the U.S. Navy he served his country during world War II. He was stationed on the USS Baldwin during anti-submarine missions in the North Atlantic, and participated in the invasion of Normandy before heading for the Pacific.

We commemorate Norman A. Herren this Centennial Year for a lifetime of service until his passing on August 20, 2003.


EVG School Update





Fishing The 10,000 Islands

Well, I just got back from the Amazon and jumped right in to some really good Snook fishing! It seems they are still in the Islands and Rivers. The water temps haven't gotten so low yet to send these fish

all deep into the back country. This will eventually happen, but for now the outside is still a great place to catch the big Snook.

I was booked my first day back here with Dave Lawrence and he had a phenomenal trip with his biggest Snook being a 35.5" fish! The next 2 days were equally great as I had clients land over a dozen slot size Snook. The biggest being a 40" beauty. These fish were all caught on live bait and all on the outside Islands and coves. This fishing should continue until a front pushes the fish into the back country. The back country does have plenty of fish also but things have been so productive on the outside I have not ventured back yet.

The Redfish were also biting on the outside but tides this week were falling so most of my Redfish action was early morning on the high falling. The incoming tide will produce more Reds but that was late this week. It is nice to be back here with some cool mornings. Hopefully these temperatures hold out for a while so we can enjoy the red hot fishing out in the Islands.

The Seatrout are really biting good also. The problem I had was the amount of small fish and Ladyfish we had to go through to get some keeper size Trout. This is loads of fun for the novice anglers and kids. Popping corks or even a knocker rig with a 1/4 oz lead is producing tons of action on the flats. Jigs and DOA shrimp are producing tons of bites, but so will shrimp and live bait.

Tarpon are still abundant in the Rivers and edges of the flats. They should continue until cold fronts push them all south. There are lots of smaller fish but I am seeing some decent fish in the 60lb to 100lb range in the Rivers.



It's That Time Again!

Shopping for the holidays used to be fun. As a little boy, I remember going downtown in Tulsa, Oklahoma and looking in the store windows on Main Street. They had been decorated for Christmas. There were a lot of stores. And a lot of windows. You could be amazed with the music being played by mechanical toys and animals. The colors of clothes on display. And the Salvation Army bell ringers were on every corner. But that's all changed. It's all gone! Now, you must drive out to the malls to get into the spirit and do your shopping.

Or better still, you don't have to go anywhere. You can do your shopping from the comfort of your own home. On-line. On your computer.

So, here are some tips to help you shop safely on-line.

1. Shop only from trustworthy retailers. Shop directly with who you know and trust. Bookmark your favorite shopping sites. You can then get to them quickly and safely. Avoid typing the name of the retailer into your browser bar. A tiny typo could land you on a fake site that looks just like the real one.

In 2019, the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center got an average of 1,300 online theft complaints per day, totaling \$3.5 billion in losses to individuals and businesses. Recently, the FBI has received a lot of complaints about consumers not receiving goods purchased online. Many buyers fell for "deals" that were advertised on social media or search engine shopping pages. They either got nothing, or they received a substitute item, like a box of disposable face masks which could be returned only by paying a high international shipping charge. Scammers really can take the joy out of shopping!

- 2. Verify the legitimacy of the website. Is it for real? Scrutinize the details of any online store you're not familiar with. Check for the padlock in the URL bar. That will give you evidence of a secure website. Routinely check your bank statements for unknown transactions.
- 3. Only use safe payment services such as PayPal, Apple Pay, or Google Wallet. Avoid using debit cards or direct bank transfers. Make sure the site you buy from uses safe payment services such as credit cards or PayPal. Most credit card companies have \$0 fraud liability policies. That means you won't be on the hook for fraudulent charges. Plus, unlike using your debit card, a hacker can't access your bank account with a stolen credit card and wipe you out.
- 4. Learn the warning signs of a scam email or social media ad. Be suspicious of emails, or social media ads which offer deals that are too good to be true. They might be phishing attempts or scams. Fraudsters create fake online stores and then use social media ads to lure you in to becoming a customer. But the products either don't arrive, aren't what you expected, or come with huge hidden fees. Criminals can even use your name, address, and credit card details to steal your identity and drain your bank account. The good news is you don't have to stop shopping online to stay safe. Get protection from online scams, identity theft, and fraud. Enable multi factor authentication (MFA) whenever possible. MFA adds an extra layer of security to your accounts by requiring additional verification beyond your password. This can help prevent unauthorized access to your accounts. Check out online shopping safety tips so you can avoid becoming a victim.
- 5. Always check shipping costs and terms before making a purchase. Some retailers might offer free shipping, while others might charge a fee.
- I hope these tips help you shop safely online and will make your holiday shopping a pleasant experience in order for you to have a Merry Christmas.



As part of an effort to spread the word, Museum Manager Thomas Lockyear and Scott Pardue, Chief of Interpretation at Big Cypress National Preserve, have been working together to promote our environmental and historic heritage.

At their Annual Luncheon on December 4, the Friends of the Museum heard from Pardue about plans to enhance the entrance to Big Cypress. He said the old visitor center (the "A-shaped" building in Carnestown at the corner of US-41 and SR-29) looks abandoned, which it is. The Preserve will demolish the structures there and build a big sign so families can take photos to show where they've been. Eventually, there will



also be a replica of the original Trail Arch which Barron Collier built to mark the Collier/Dade County line.

It is appropriate that this work will be mostly done in 2024 which is the 50th anniversary

of the establishment of first National Preserve, thanks to Nathaniel Reed who pressured the federal government to save the Big Cypress from development in 1974.

Scott said he was glad to cooperate with other local organizations and the County Tourist Development Board to stress that the area is not *Disneyland* but well-worth visiting because of its respect for the unique environment.
