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A Pedestrian and Bike-Friendly Future

In our beautiful Everglades City, a community-driven effort is reshaping the urban landscape. With a focus on promoting healthier lifestyles, fostering economic growth, and enhancing the overall appeal of the town, the Everglades City Bike/Pedestrian Plan is making significant strides.

The journey toward creating a more walkable and bikefriendly environment began in 2006, when the Collier Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) completed the Copeland Avenue North Bike Lanes and the Collier Avenue Sidewalks.

However, it was in 2019 that pivotal steps were taken, with the establishment of the Bike/Pedestrian Committee, and Everglades City officially being designated a Florida Trail Town. The Committee brought together dedicated individuals from various facets

of the community with the aim of assessing

However, it was in 2019 that pivotal steps needs and setting priorities for projects within were taken, with the establishment of the the city.

The primary goals of the committee were clear—to establish a local Bike/Ped network and provide residents and visitors safe and accessible spaces for walking, biking, hiking, and jogging. Unfortunately, the assessment



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faced significant delays due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, but this setback only fueled the determination of those involved.

In August 2020, a collaborative effort from Mayor Howie Grimm's office, Dottie Joiner, and the Clerk's Office, alongside the City Council and the Bike/Pedestrian Committee, launched a comprehensive Master Plan. The See **Bike-Friendly** p12

They're Baaaack, The Enchanting Return of Roseate Spoonbills



They're back but do you know how they got here? Can you tell me anything about them other than they are beautiful... and loud?

As the Roseate Spoonbills grace us with their vibrant presence this season, it's a perfect time to delve deeper into the fascinating world of these favorite birds. There's much to discover about the remarkable Roseate Spoonbill.

These elegant creatures are closely related to Ibises, Herons, and Egrets characterized by long legs and bills, these birds share similar wading behaviors and feeding habits.

Roseate Spoonbills embark on a captivating migratory journey, gracing Florida with their vibrant presence during the breeding season from March to October, where they prefer the bays, marshes, and estuaries along the Gulf Coast. As winter transitions to spring, these distinctive birds return to Florida, traversing various habitats along the Gulf Coast. Upon reaching the Sunshine State, they meticulously choose coastal mangroves and dredged-made islands as nesting grounds, showcasing adaptability to changing environments.

Rising sea levels have reshaped the fringes of wetlands into open ocean, prompting the spoonbills to migrate northward. Land managers are closely following their lead, engaging in ecosystem restoration with a focus on building resilience.

Over the past two decades, Roseate Spoonbills have shifted their nesting grounds, showcasing their ability to adapt to changes in climate and habitat. Now, they raise their young in areas with saltier soils and warmer winters, taking advantage of the mangroves that have colonized what was once freshwater habitat miles inland.

This year's return is not just a spectacle; it's a story of survival and triumph. Once victims of the plume trade that reduced their numbers to a





mere 30 nesting pairs, Roseate Spoonbills have made a remarkable recovery. Their specialized spoon-shaped bill, equipped with sensitive nerve endings, plays a crucial role in capturing prey in shallow waters.

Beyond their aesthetic appeal, Roseate Spoonbills serve as "indicator species" for water quantity and quality in the Everglades. Their sensitivity to changes in water levels and quality makes them environmental sentinels, reflecting the delicate balance of their ecosystem.

Honey, I Thought You Said This Was Florida

It's that time of year. Floridians boast of wearing shorts, flip flops and enjoying mild temperatures with blue skies. Well, maybe not this year. Something's happened. It got cold! And it's being blamed on Global Warming! South Florida is supposed to be one of the warmest places in Florida. That's why people come from up North down to Naples, Ft. Lauderdale, Miami, and the Florida Keys because much of the Florida climate is subtropical that results in mild winters and hot, sunny summers.

However, some are calling this Global Weirding. Climatologists tell us there's increasing evidence that climate change is what's bringing us this weird weather. And they say it's going to get worse! The drop in Florida's temperature is but one example. The difference between rainfall and

drought is another. It's caused by what's called the water cycle. That's when water passes from vapor in the atmosphere to precipitation upon land or water and ultimately goes back into the atmosphere because of evaporation. Recently, a sudden downpour dropped two feet of rain in twenty-four hours on Ft. Lauderdale. That, together with unusually high tides, is causing insurance companies to raise their rates all over Florida. Everglades City and Chokoloskee are feeling the effects as well.

According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), El Niño, an irregular periodic variation in winds and sea surface temperatures over the tropical eastern Pacific Ocean, affects the climate of much of the tropics and subtropics here in Florida. A periodic climate pattern has grown since June and could match the strongest events ever on record for Winter in Florida.

El Niños normally mean cooler, stormier and wetter winters for Florida as the Jet Stream moves across the southern United States. *Florida Today* reports that Florida is experiencing a cold, rainy, and grey 2024 winter due to El Niño. And the weather pattern has brought chilly temperatures, gray skies, and rain. Central and South Florida usually get one or two inches above the eight to ten inches of winter rain the region sees in a typical non-El Niño winter. But this El Niño is shaping up to be one of the strongest in recent memory. During more extreme El Niño years, some parts of Central Florida can see five inches above average wintertime rain-fall. Increased rain and clouds during El Niño tend to result in cooler winter months in the Southeastern United States. Some studies suggest that might be the case in Florida during El Niño winters.

It's worth noting, however, Florida is usually protected from extremely wintry conditions because of its geography and location. Water surrounds Florida on three sides. And these bodies of water are often warmer than land at night during the winter, which helps warm air masses that move in.


How long will this last? Who knows? The duration of the cold weather in Florida is not certain. However, according to a news article from *NBC News Miami*, the arctic blast will impact all of Florida. And it will be felt as far south as Homestead. Another news article that's worth noting is from the *Ft. Myers News-Press*. Winter weather in Florida typically lasts from





plan aimed not just to address immediate concerns but to lay the groundwork for a transformative project that would improve the town's overall infrastructure for pedestrians and cyclists.

The project gained approval and funding from The Florida Department of Transportation. The scope expanded to include the section between the Chokoloskee Bridge and the city limits, near the Diving Pelican. A particularly noteworthy addition was the incorporation of enhanced pedestrian infrastructure around the traffic circle, featuring four crosswalks to ensure safe passage.

The project has progressed steadily, overcoming challenges, and according to onsite reports, it is anticipated to conclude within the next few months. The transformation promises not only a boost in safety but a remarkable improvement in the overall community experience.

The Master Plan underlines the broader impact of this initiative, stating, "A welldeveloped system of sidewalks and bike paths will provide additional economic benefits to our local businesses and will complement the historical and cultural assets of the community." The ripple effects of this project extend beyond the physical infrastructure, contributing to the socio-economic vibrancy of Everglades City.

A heartfelt thanks goes out to the individuals instrumental in making this vision a reality.
